

A recap was recently published in Panorama; congratulations to the Fox Valley Region for sharing their story and submitting it to Panorama. Kentucky Region not only had fun with hosting their Annual Autumn Derby, but also had a successful weekend hosting their Putnam Park Pumpkin Run DE.

The weekend prior to Thanksgiving, the Chicago Region celebrated a Fast 50 Years of Porsche Club held at the Butterfield Country Club. Some 200 members came out to enjoy the history and festivities. President Chuck LaMantia did a great job as MC and PCA National Secretary, Manny Alban attended and spoke during the evening's festivities. Congratulations to the Chicago Region on their 50th Anniversary of a Porsche Club Charter.

Lincoln Trail has been working on the possibility of hosting a Teen Driving Program in Spring 2008. The region is currently working out the logistics; additional info will follow as it becomes available. Lincoln Trail will also be celebrating 45 years of being a Porsche Club of America in 2008. Another exciting tidbit is that the Blue Grass Region is planning to host the PCA Executive Council Spring Board meeting in April 2008 in Lexington, Kentucky. Watch for more details of these exciting events and many more in 2008.

National News

The Executive Council gathered just prior to Rennsport III in Daytona for their Fall Board Meeting.

Betty Jo Turner reported that for the end of 2007, that advertising income within Panorama is up, but so are the costs of printing the publication. Ken Laborde advised that the "908" lawsuit finally has closure. PCA's insurance carrier has requested statistical data about the incidents that have occurred this year during driver education events. Vu Nguyen reported that the National Office is doing well and an open house was held in September with approximately 150 guests visiting. Prescott Kelly and Bob Miller advised that Porsche AG and PCNA have stepped up again in sponsoring Porschplatzes at most of the ALMS races in 2008.

Tom Bobbitt reported on the most recent "Escape to American History" that was hosted by the Potomac Region. Perhaps due to the relocations, the event had about 85 Porsches and 150 attendees. Kurt Gibson reported that "Escape to the Land of Enchantment" that will be hosted by the Road Runner Region will include a PCA off road event. As a reminder, PCA's DE committee has a new 2008 harness guidelines going into affect. Kurt is working on trying to find an insurance carrier that might be willing to underwrite track DE insurance. Many auto insurance companies have changed the language within their policy that may exclude an event held at a facility for racing.

Bruce Boeder, announced that licensed club racer counts are holding steady. A club race will be held at VIR (Virginia International Raceway) with former PCA President, Tom Bobbitt being the race chairman. Timing Tech travel expenses will now be covered by the Club Racing Committee to assist the Region's with their race weekend expenses.

Manny Alban confirmed the 2008 Winter Board meeting will be January 31 – February 2 in Ft. Worth, Texas. Carolyn Ewbanks, National Membership Chair has composed the latest "Region Focus" on the topic of Membership Retention. The article is available on the club's website and is worth reading.
