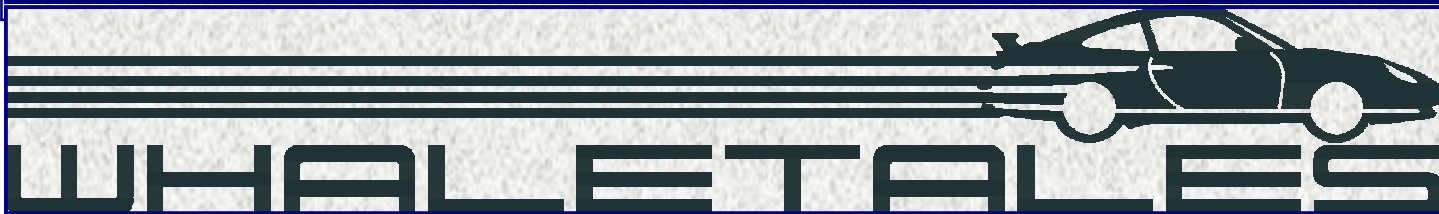

PCA Membership Information

RECORDS CHECK

I am asking a favor of all of our members that should only take a couple of minutes. You can do it at any time. I am requesting **everyone**, please log on to www.pca.org and check the accuracy of your membership records. I don’t know if some peoples’ handwriting were difficult for the PCA staff to read on your application or renewal form, or if someone on the other end wasn’t quite as careful about data entry as we would like them to be. Either way, I know several members’ records have incorrect/outdated e-mail addresses, incorrect phone numbers, missing/incorrect car information etc. On many occasions, I have gone into members’ records and changed the information for them, if I knew the accurate data.

Those of you who have recently received the membership roster from me can also check that everything listed about you and your car(s) is accurate.

To log in, and make any necessary corrections, please do the following: Go to www.pca.org

At the bottom you will log in. The username box requires your first initial followed by your last name, with no spaces, then the last four digits of your PCA membership number. If you don’t have your number or card, please e-mail me and I can give it to you. For example, mine is “lprellwitzXXXX”. In the password box, enter pca and again the last four digits of your membership number, so it is “pcaXXXX”. A blue box should appear on the right hand side of your screen with your personal information displayed.

Click on anything in that blue area and another page with boxes will appear for you to make any needed corrections. Enter the corrected information, then submit.

Click on the small button “more info”, then “cars” to check information on your car. Enter any corrections, additions, etc. **Click insert.**

Or if you prefer, send the correct information to me and I can update your records for you.

Thank you! This will make communication amongst ourselves much easier for everyone! Remember, you can also renew your membership on this same site, too.

Accomplishments of the Fox Valley Region for the first half of 2008

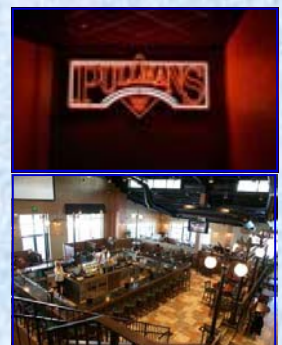

Wolfgang Porsche turns 65 - Shareholder, Member of the Supervisory Board, Family Spokesman and Entrepreneur

Stuttgart. Dr. Wolfgang Porsche, Shareholder and Chairman of the Supervisory Board of Porsche Automobile Holding SE, as well as Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche AG, is celebrating his 65th birthday on May 10, 2008. Ferdinand ('Ferry') Porsche's youngest son, who was born in Stuttgart, has been a member of the Supervisory Board of the sports car manufacturer since 1978. He has also been family spokesman since the death of his father Ferry in 1998.

Wolfgang Porsche has always seen it as his primary duty to continue to drive forward the company in the same spirit that his father Ferry and grandfather Ferdinand intended when they founded and built up the firm, in close collaboration with the members of the Porsche and Piëch families. As a result of this fundamental stance, he contributed significantly to the increase in capital that occurred in 1992 to ensure the continued independence of the family-owned company, and has also influenced all further important business decisions. This particularly includes decisions relating to the expansion of the product portfolio to include the Roadster Boxster, the Cayenne sports utility vehicle, and the four-seater Gran Turismo Panamera, as well as the building of the Leipzig plant, and last but not least, the stake of Porsche AG in the Volkswagen Group in 2005.

As Dr. Wendelin Wiedeking, CEO of Porsche SE, notes: "Throughout the past 16 years, Wolfgang Porsche has tirelessly supported us as an approachable and competent advisor, both on everyday questions as well as on the various strategic decisions we have faced to position the company in the best way. This advice has always been open and frank, and he has served as an essential bridge between company and shareholders. In all decisions, the Porsche Managing Board could always count on his integrity and his support, and for this we are extremely thankful".

Wolfgang Porsche was born on May 10, 1943, the youngest son of Dorothea and Ferry Porsche, the founder of the sports car icon. He spent the first 6 ½ years of his life at the so called 'Schüttgut' in Zell am See, Austria, to which his parents and grandparents had retreated during the final years of the war. The family returned to Stuttgart in 1950. At first, Wolfgang went to the Waldorf School in Stuttgart, before moving over to the Odenwald School in Heppenheim. It was here that he obtained his Abitur (higher school-leaving certificate) in 1965, and at the same time abandoned his training as an apprentice locksmith. Following this, he obtained his degree in Business Administration from the Vienna University of Economics and Business Administration. He received his doctorate in International Business in 1973.

After completing his studies, Wolfgang Porsche went into business, and became an importer for Yamaha motorbikes in Austria, a trade that he pursued successfully for 27 years. He returned to Stuttgart in 1976, and worked at the then Daimler-Benz AG as a manager in several different areas of domestic and foreign sales. In 1978 he was appointed a member of the Supervisory Board of Porsche AG, taking over the position of Chairman in January 2007. He was also appointed Chairman of the Supervisory Board of Porsche Automobil Holding SE at its incorporation in June 2007. In addition, he has been a member of the Supervisory Board of Porsche Holding Ges.m.b.H. in Salzburg, the largest Austrian trading company, since 1983. Furthermore, he is Chairman of the Advisory Board of the Swiss watch manufacturer Eterna S.A. in Grenchen, and, since April 24, 2008, a member of the Supervisory Board of Volkswagen AG, Wolfsburg.

On the death of his father Ferry in 1998, he was selected as spokesman by the Porsche family. As such, Wolfgang Porsche considers his main role to be that of an intermediary and consensus-builder between the individual family members to ensure that the shared goal of the independence and financial stability of the Porsche company is never compromised. His calm, objective style, as well as his wit and humor, are his chief assets. In this regard, Wolfgang Porsche has even described himself as a 'Swabian Austrian', for whom level-headedness, reliability and tradition are all important. The father-of-four lives alternately in Munich, Stuttgart, and at the paternal 'Schüttgut' in Zell am See, which he has inherited. A keen hunter, he has always maintained his special affinity with the sports car icon that is still 'made in Zuffenhausen', both to its past and its present.

Wolfgang Porsche has received numerous honors for his services to business.

In 2005 he was awarded the 'Great Golden Medal for Services to the Republic of Austria' by the Prime Minister of Austria, the highest award granted by the country of his birth.

SUPERMILEAGE EVENT at FVTC—MAY 2 & 3, 2008

Super Mileage Event by Fox Valley Technical College

Friday, May 2nd and Saturday, May 3rd.

The 2008 Supermileage portion of the WEEVA Challenge at Fox Valley Technical College (FVTC) was a rousing success! The frigid temperatures were not a deterrent to the participants from the 21 schools from all over Wisconsin.

Some statistics: Supermileage vehicles ran a total of 797 laps on Saturday; there were 204 runs started; there were 116 official runs completed. Over 60 vehicles participated. These are home-made vehicles which the students designed and calibrated to attain the highest mileage possible. Some of the cars started runs and for whatever reason, were unable to finish and given a DNF. The pick-up vehicles were busy all day. The best run made 417.1 mpg, with many runs coming in the 300 mpg range. Of course, not everyone was in that range. But they gave it their all and did their best.

Our Fox Valley region donated \$500 to this event, (refer to note attached below) which will be used to purchase a new ramp for safety inspection. This year the ramp was damaged during the Friday Safety inspections at FVTC. The actual runs were on the half mile banked asphalt at Wisconsin International Raceway (WIR) on Saturday.



The volunteerism from our Club was somewhat light—Larry Rogers and Joe & Peg Homel were the only course marshals from our group. Club members Mike and Alyson Wenzlick attended with their son who was part of the electric car team from NEWTC in Green Bay. Interestingly, the driver of that car drove his PORSCHE to the track on Saturday. Another interesting entry was an all-girls team from Brillion High School. Their car, painted in pink and black, had the “Racing for the Cure” logo on it’s side, and, when the body was removed, written on the chassis were the words ”we’re working our ----- off to beat your ---”.

Next year, we need to get more volunteers to experience the excitement and enthusiasm of these kids for their project. You too, can come away with the feeling that you have done something worthwhile for our young people—and have a great time doing it!

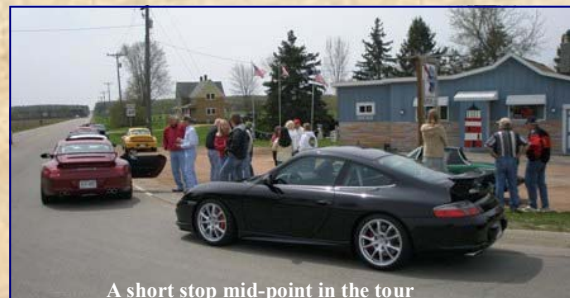
RUSTIC ROAD TOUR - MAY 10TH, 2008

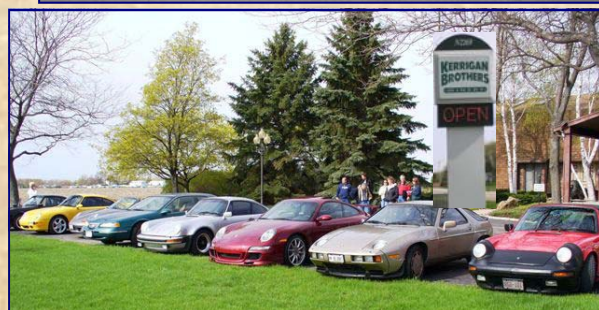


John & Sherry Lazar, from Custer, Wisconsin, chose this event as their first ever to participate in and we were honored to have them join us in their 1975 914.

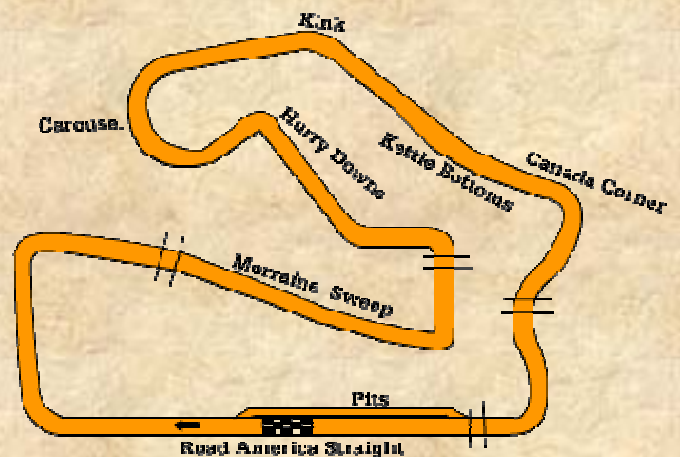

Leaving the Park and Ride, you will be on Cty. V. Go east to Kohler-Andrae state park. Go past the park office and follow the main road. We will also stop at the Sanderling Nature Center. Optional walk on the boardwalk. Follow tour through the rest of the park.

“The fascinating rolling sand dunes and the viewing of prevalent wildlife make Kohler-Andrae State Park a must visit for outdoor-minded visitors. The Sanderling Nature Center offers many interesting displays and its auditorium is the site of educational presentations and programs that take place throughout the year. Perhaps enjoyed more than any other feature at the parks are the dunes, the sandy beach and the various all-purpose trails that range from 1.3 to 4.3 miles in length. The boardwalk/cord walk is a favorite of seniors. A number of special events are planned annually on the trails with the torch-lit hiking and skiing events particularly popular. There are 105 available campsites, open year-round.” Exit the park on Cty. V going west.

At the intersection of I-43, turn right and go north. Notice the huge American flag at the Acuity insurance building. “Erected on Acuity’s immaculately manicured grounds stands the nation’s tallest flagpole. The pole, taller than a football field is long, flies a flag longer than a football field is wide. The pole is 338’ high and measure 6’ wide at the base and weighs 65 tons. The pole is sunk into a 550 ton block of concrete that is 40 feet deep and eight feet wide. It is reinforced with countless steel rods. The flag measures 120’ by 60’ or 7200 square feet and weighs 300 lbs. Each star is 3’ high and each strips is 4.5’ wide. Visible from miles away, America’s tallest flagpole is near exit #123 along I-43.”

Continue north to exit #126 or Hwy. 23 West towards Kohler. Go 2/3 of a mile, turn right onto Cty. Y. Go south one mile on Highland Drive to the Kohler Design Center. “Discover a world of gracious living in the premier showroom for the nation’s leading plumbing products manufacturer, Kohler Co. More than two dozen designer bath vignettes, along with product displays for Baker and McGuire furniture and Ann Sacks tile and Stone, fill the dramatic 36,000 square foot, three-level space and offer an abundance of kitchen, bath, and home furnishing ideas. Tour the ceramic art gallery and see the fascinating displays of historic Kohler Village and Kohler Co. in the lower level museum.”

Follow Highland Drive south to Cty. PP. Turn right, going towards Sheboygan Falls. Follow Cty. PP to Cty. PPP, then to Hwy. 28 West. Turn left onto Cty. U. Follow Cty. U to Parnell Tower. FREE picnic lunch will be served. “One of the highlights of the Ice Age Trail hike is going up the Parnell Tower. Located in the heart of the Kettle Moraine State Forest, near the intersection of County Hwy. A and Kettle View Road, this 60’ wooden observation tower was rebuilt in 1988 and offers a panoramic view of the forest and surrounding farmlands. On a clear day, one can see about 25 miles.”

From the tower, follow Cty. U ¼ mile to Cty. A. Go south on Cty. A to Cty. SS west to New Prospect. Turn left onto Cty. G to Mauthe Lake State Park. Tour park. There is a hiking trail around the lake if you are interested. “Sheboygan County’s portion of the Northern Unit of the Kettle Moraine State Forest includes some 14,865 acres along the western boundary of the county. Across the impressive terrain created by gouging glaciers stretch 71 miles of picturesque hiking trails, 58 miles of groomed snowmobile trails, 39 miles of scenic bridle trails, 15 miles of cross-country ski trails as well as extensive areas and facilities for picnicking, hunting, fishing, primitive camping, biking, tobogganing, and general sightseeing and appreciation of the outdoors.”

Exit park, turn right onto Cty. G and go north to Dundee. Turn right onto Cty. F, going east. Turn left onto Division Road, then left onto Butler Lake Road. Enter Long Lake State Park. Tour park.

Exit Long Lake, go east on Butler Lake Road to Cty. V going north to Hwy. 67. Follow Hwy. 67 north towards Plymouth, turn onto Cty. A to Greenbush. Stop at the Old Wade House State Historic Site. It’s Visitor Appreciation Day. Last tour is at 4 PM and the building closes at 5 PM.

“The Wade House Stagecoach Inn was built in 1850 to serve the traffic on the busy Sheboygan and Fond du Lac Plank Road, offering food, shelter and respite for travelers passing through and settling Sheboygan County. Enterprising Yankee (New England) settlers Sylvanus and Betsy Wade built this center of refinement in the Wisconsin wilderness, replacing the log cabin that had house them since 1844. A rare survival, the period furnished interior of this landmark 27-room stagecoach inn remains inviting to those who visit today. Costumed guides lead interactive tours of this impressive structure. The trade of the site features the meticulously reconstructed Herrling Sawmill and Dockstader Blacksmith Shop. Originally owned and operated by German immigrant Theodor Herrling, the water-powered muley type up-and-down sawmill is one of just a handful of its type in North America. Designed to saw boards and planks from logs, the mill provided important cut lumber to the local economy. Tours and demonstrations offered throughout the day. At the Blacksmith Shop, visitors watch as sparks fly and fires dance in the forge as the smith demonstrates how to pound hot iron into tools and items once used by the 19th century residents of Greenbush. Costumed experts demonstrate this fascinating craft on a daily basis. The magnificent Pabst Family park drag and rare Velvet Tobacco Co. peddler’s wagon are examples of the more than 100 horse-drawn vehicles on display at the Wesley Jung Carriage Museum. The museum houses Wisconsin’s largest and one of America’s finest collections of 19th and 20th century horse-drawn vehicles, many restored by Wesley Jung of Sheboygan.”

Leaving the Wade House, follow Cty. A. to Hwy. 23 east. Take Hwy. 23 to I-43, concluding the tour.

Driving Season Nears

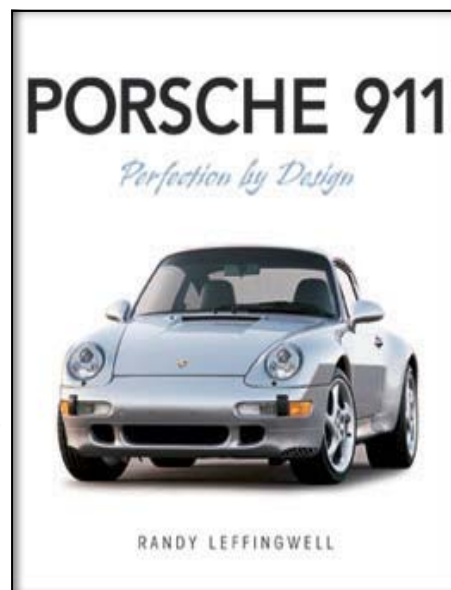

Car Care Tips from Jimmy

A couple of folks on the tour ask how I always keep my car so shiny. And I'm no expert but.....

Here's the frugal secret...and it's on sale for \$4.44 each at Fleet Farm as shown in today's paper.

Meguiars Deep Crystal products:

16 oz paint cleaner (done initially about 3 years ago),

16 oz polish once annually, must be immediately followed within minutes by...

14 oz carnauba wax. again once annually.

I apply it to all my vehicles with a random orbit buffer with a foam pad...but it could be done by hand. It goes on very thin, so a bottle lasts for a half dozen or more cars.

Then before each trip I wipe the whole car including glass & rims (and sometimes even the leather) down quickly with Meguiars Quik Detailer spray (about \$10) & an old cotton bath towel that I keep in the car.

Tire Shine wipes from Menards for \$3 do a nice job in seconds on the vinyl/ rubber exterior parts & bra.

Wash & Bleach the wax towels after each vehicle.

Just launder the detailer towel with your car wash rags.

Do your mats & interior carpet annually with rented "Rug Doctor" while you're doing your home floors.

Hope that helps!
