

2012 Escape - Eureka Springs, Arkansas - November 8-11

Escape, like the Parade, moves around each year and is typically held on the opposite side of the country from the Parade. It is a multi-event weekend, with a national attendance list. While the Parade has a competitive focus, Escape is purely non-competitive. It is a socially oriented weekend focusing on camaraderie and friendship. It is a great opportunity to show off your car, see old friends, make new ones, and enjoy the good will and fellowship of other Porsche owners. All this without the pressure of: "Did I miss that speck of dirt?" or "Is this the fastest line through the track?" or "Was that a rally landmark?"

Typically a long weekend, such as Thursday through Sunday, Escapes usually consists of banquets, driving tours, drives to local area attractions and perhaps a "People's choice" car show. Other activities may include an "off road" event for our Cayenne enthusiasts. There may also be organized group lunches or free time (either day or evening) to allow you to explore area restaurants and culture on your own. 
Porsche at Techno Classica 2012

Stuttgart. Porsche Classic will be exhibiting from 21- 25 March 2012 at the biggest Classic trade fair in the world in Essen, this time showcasing its comprehensive service offering on a stand with more than twice the area compared with last year. A particular highlight is the legendary 911 Carrera RS 2.7, celebrating its 40th anniversary this year.

To mark the occasion, Porsche is presenting two racing versions of the 911 Carrera RS from the Porsche Museum at the new location in Hall 7.0. The 1973 vintage 911 Carrera RSR delivers 330 hp. The ultimate RS variant dating from 1974, the 911 Carrera RSR Turbo with its two-metre wide rear end, even manages a sensational 500 hp, which it achieves with a mere 2.1 litre displacement. The "40 years of the 911 Carrera RS" anniversary is rounded off by a 911 Carrera RS 2.7, that has been restored by the Porsche Classic workshop specialists. Also on show is an early Porsche 911, which is currently being restored for a customer at Porsche Classic.

The specialists' repertoire comprises the repair, maintenance and restoration of classic Porsche road vehicles as well as the provision of original spare parts.

Together with a Porsche museum information stand, Porsche Exclusive & Tequipment will also be represented on the spacious 600 plus square metre stand. A custom-equipped 911 Carrera of the current 991 model series is being used to showcase the comprehensive personalisation options. Porsche Design Driver's Selection rounds off the varied offering on the Porsche stand with a wide selection of Porsche accessories.

The first lot for sale, a 1912 Ford Model T Speedster, sells for just \$22,000 (before the 10% buyers premium); barely 50% of its predicted low-end estimate of \$40,000. Things can only get better, right? Not so. The next two lots sell either below their estimated price or at the low-end of the expected range.

Up comes Lot #4. A 1973 Porsche 911 Carrera RS 2.7. Here's a car that has to sell. After all, there are 25 Porsches for sale in this auction (including 17 from

the now famous Drendel Family Collection). This should be a decidedly Porsche crowd one would think. This particular Porsche is being sold with reserve (meaning it must meet a predetermined price known only to the owner and the auction house before it will sell). Auctioneer Charlie Ross gets the bidding started at \$100k and with his usual charm quickly moves the crowd, and the bidding, north of \$200,000. But then it simply stalls. At this point I don't know if it is something to do with this particular Porsche, the rising temperature in the tent, or if bidders are simply saving their money for the Drendel Porsches. Whatever the reason, this Porsche is passed (meaning it didn't meet the sellers reserve) with a high bid of \$260,000 (well below the anticipated price range of \$300,000 to \$375,000). However, it does eventually sell later in the day for \$275,000.

Now I'm nervous. What does this mean for the Drendel family? Is there any relation? The next 10 lots come and go in similar fashion, they are either withdrawn (taken out of the auction before it even starts), passed or sold at what can only be considered relative bargains compared to their pocket guide estimates. In fact, a new friend of ours, and owner of a very special Porsche Carrera GTS, picks up a 1968 Shelby GT500 KR for \$127,500 (over \$30,000 less than the low estimate of the \$160,000 to \$200,000 range). Then lot #15 rolls onto the stage.

It Takes Less Than 12 Minutes to Turn A Slow Auction into A World Record Setter

Lot 15 is perhaps the most original Porsche 550 on the planet. We know this particular Porsche personally and can attest to its provenance and originality. So it is no surprise when the bidding starts at an even million for this most sought after of Porsches. What is surprising is how fast the bids grow. We are tweeting as fast as big thumbs on an iphone allow, but it's not fast enough. Our first tweet is at 11:57 mentioning the start of the auction. By 11:59 the price is climbing past \$2.7MM and we can't tweet fast enough to keep up. Six minutes later and it looks like it's all over. The price settles at \$3,100,000 and the hammer is coming down when another bidder jumps in on the phone.

The crowd is really into it now. There are three active bidders all vying for the 550 and it seems that no price is too high. The price continues to move up in small increments. The bidder on the phone obviously wants this Porsche and is willing to pay for it. He does. The hammer comes down for a final time at 12:09 pm marking a price of \$3,350,000 (before the 10% buyer premium) and setting a new world record for a 550 and the first of many for the day.

10 More Porsche World Auction Records Follow

With the sale of the 550 complete the temperature doesn't seem quite as stifling. I'm not sure if this is due to Gooding and Company opening some side vents on the tent to let in a cross breeze or if the worry has left the room now that a record price is set. Either way, I'm not alone in this feeling. The next 30 lots blow by in a blur including a 1971 Ferrari 356 GTB/4 Daytona Spider selling for over \$1,000,000 and a 1953 Fiat 8V that was at first passed but eventually brings \$750,000. It seems the stage is set for the Drendel Family Collection.

Let the Craziness Begin

The first of 17 Porsches from the Drendel Collection arrives on the auction block in the form of an unassuming 1988 Porsche 944 Turbo S. Selling without reserve at an estimated price of \$50,000 to \$65,000 this first turbo hammers out at \$80,000 (\$88,000 with the buyers premium). The Drendel collection is off to a great start and things only get better from their. It's obvious this crowd is here to buy these Porsches.

One by one the Drendel Collection come across the block and one by one they sell. When the dusts settles these 17 incredible Porsches bring in nearly \$18,000,000 in total, achieve 9 of the 11 Porsche records set that day including a double world auction record for the highest price paid for a Porsche at \$4,400,000 for the 1973 917/30 Can-Am.

In fact, of the 70 cars sold by Gooding over the course of this auction, 25 of them are Porsches bringing in \$23,388,200. That's means that only 36% of the cars sold accounted for more than 65% of the \$36,057,800 in total sales. A very, very strong showing for Porsche.

us who own or follow German cars. In addition to the traditional "club day" on Saturday (8/25) which is open to all margues to gather on the grounds, there is a special class for the feature day on Sunday (8/26). On Sunday there will be a class for Teutonic Touring and Track Cars. The class will be open to German touring and race cars which are 1973 or older. Eligible margues include Mercedes Benz, Porsche, Audi, BMW, VW, etc. How about a Ford Lincoln/ Mercury Capri rally car? Sunday is a by invitation event with those that wish to display their car applying for acceptance. It is really painless. In my case, I needed a little plastic clip for my Cayenne, I found this drawing of the part with the Porsche part number and called Bergstrom Fox Valley who ordered the part for me locally, without paying shipping and without having to go from Green Bay to Appleton to see their ordering page. check it out! http://www.autoatlanta.com/porsche-parts/911.php

And in a related topic:

Since there's no Porsche dealer in Green Bay, I called Broadway, a full line VW dealer. They said if I give them the Porsche part number, any VW parts dealer can query the "VW parts locator service" which tells if a VW or Audi part is identical to the Porsche part, whether they have it in stock, and if not,...which VW, Porsche, or Audi dealer in the network has it in stock and available today.

Sebring 12 Hours: Successful start for the Porsche 911 GT3 RSR


The tradition-steeped race on the airfield circuit of Sebring (17 March) marked the start of the new World Endurance Championship (WEC) and the American Le Mans Series. In the WEC, works drivers Marc Lieb, Richard Lietz and Patrick Pilet clinched second place in the GTE Pro class for Felbermayr-Proton at the wheel of the new Porsche 911 GT3 RSR. In the amateur GTE Am category, Christian Ried, Gianluca Roda and Paolo Ruberti made a faultless start to the season with a victory in last year's 911 GT3 RSR. Bad luck, however, for the Porsche drivers in the ALMS: Flying Lizards Motorsports' 911 GT3 RSR piloted by Jörg Bergmeister, Patrick Long and Marco Holzer was rammed by a Ferrari in the formation lap. Bergmeister and his colleagues still managed to yield tenth place. Wolf Henzler, Bryan Sellers and Martin Ragginger claimed ninth in the Falken Tire Porsche after an engine change.

Tribute: Hans Herrmann inducted into the Sebring Hall of Fame

The organisers of the Sebring 12 hour race pay tribute to the performances of extraordinary race drivers by inducting them into the Hall of Fame. In the lead up to this year's race, Hans Herrmann received this very rare honour. The former Porsche works driver, born 1928, won the Sebring classic twice, contributed to Porsche claiming the manufacturers' world title in 1969 and 1970, and clinched the first overall victory for Porsche at Le Mans with Richard Attwood in 1970.

Convalescence: Works driver Timo Bernhard on the way to recovery

Porsche factory pilot Timo Bernhard has to take several weeks of time out. During testing with an Audi in Sebring (USA), he went off the track at high speed through no fault of his own and slammed backwards into the barrier. At hospital an injury to his cervical spine was diagnosed. An operation is not necessary. However, Bernhard has to remain in the USA

for some time and is wearing a neck brace for support. "I'll take things easy so that I can get fit again quickly," says the Porsche works driver. "My wife Katharina has joined me here in Florida and she's helping me with the necessary check-up examinations. As soon as the doctors give me the clearance to fly, we'll be back in Germany."

Carrera Cup Asia: Tenth season features largest grid in history

With 27 competitors, the Carrera Cup Asia enters its tenth season with the largest grid line up in its history. In Shanghai and Singapore the Asian Carrera Cup runs as support to the Formula 1.

Carrera Cup Australia: Champion Craig Baird unbeatable in Melbourne

Three races, three victories and the points lead. After a faultless weekend as support to the Formula 1 Grand Prix in Melbourne (16/18 March), Craig Baird elbowed Alex Davison from the top of the points' table. Davison had led the series after winning two races at the first weekend in Adelaide (3/4 March). Ex-Formula 1 driver Heinz-Harald Frentzen gave an impressive performance at his guest drive in Melbourne yielding two fourth places. This marked the first time at the wheel of a Porsche 911 GT3 Cup for the German. Next round: 4 to 6 May in Perth, WA.

Carrera Cup Deutschland: Additional race on Saturday

The German Carrera Cup takes off: In addition to the 80 kilometre race on Sunday, competitors in 2012 also contest a 60 kilometre sprint on Saturday. Also new this season is the B classification for amateurs as well as a rookie category for new-comers up to 25 years old. The price money increases by 100,000 Euro to now total more than half a million Euro. Nine race weekends with an event on the Nürburgring-Nordschleife as the highlight make up the calendar. The season kicks off on 28 April in Hockenheim.

Carrera Cup Japan: New junior driver - season highlight alongside Formula 1


Again in 2012, a talented young driver is given the chance to launch his career in the Carrera Cup Japan. 18-year-old Ryo Hirakawa competes with the support of Porsche Japan in a 911 GT3 Cup fielded by the Garmin Team. Hirakawa comes from formula racing and contests his first GT season. He faces tough opposition from the likes of GT aces Igor Sushko and Shinichi Yamaji from the Japanese Super GT. Two Porsche Centres join the series for the first time, with Excellence Motorsports running the 100th 911 GT3 Cup imported into Japan. Okayama hosts the first of eleven races on 1 April. Season highlight: The race as support to the Japan Grand Prix in Suzuka, 5/7 October.

Race notes: Record grids in the GT3 Cup Challenge USA and the GT3 Cup Challenge Brasil with 39 and 37 Porsche 911 GT3 Cup respectively. +++ After just the tenth of twelve races in the GT3 Cup Challenge Middle East 2011/12, Abdulaziz Al Faisal from Saudi Arabia is the champion. +++ Manthey Racing contracted Porsche works driver Marco Holzer for the International GT Open to race a new 911 GT3 RSR in the pan-European championship. His teammate is Britain's Nick Tandy. The pair competes against their works driver colleague Patrick Pilet, who shares driving duties with Raymond Narac in a 911 GT3 RSR run by the IMSA Performance Matmut squad.
