



Tour Route:

- We will leave Aurora at 11:30am and proceed to Omro via highway 21 west.
- After crossing the Fox river in Omro, we will turn right onto highway 116.


A New Book in Library, #234!

Porsche Carrera 964: 1989-1994 Technical Data - Without Guesswork: Carrera 2, Carrera 4, RS America, Turbo 3.3, Turbo 3.6

Where appropriate, the handbook delivers very helpful 911 - specific repair instructions and notes. Even if you're an old hand at replacing drive belts on other cars, when replacing the alternator and cooling fan belts on a 911 you have to "adjust V-belt tension by moving adjustment shims to inside or outside of pulley halves." When replacing the clutch, you'll need to know that the "cross-shaft needle bearings are not identical [so check] proper location before installing." Not sure where the antenna amplifier is mounted? According to a chart in the Electrical section, it's in the luggage compartment near the right hood hinge.

Porsche Racing News

Autoweek has reported that Porsche has confirmed that it will bring its new 911 GT3 R hybrid to Petit Le Mans at Road Atlanta on Oct. 2 to compete in the American Le Mans Series season finale.

Porsche and the ALMS made the official announcement on July 21. Wolfgang Durheimer, Porsche's executive vice president of research and development, had told AutoWeek during the 24 Hours of the Nürburgring two months ago that the company was almost certain to race the car at Petit.

"[We] are going to bring it [to Petit] because the [U.S.] is one-third of our market," said Durheimer at the 'Ring. "The ALMS is very 'green.' . . . I had a phone call with [series boss Scott Atherton] and he asked me when will we show up [and race the hybrid], so I told him as soon as possible."

The 911 GT3 R hybrid uses a flywheel-driven kinetic-energy-recovery system developed by the Williams Formula One team, featuring two electric motors at the front axle with each developing 60 kilowatts to supplement the 480 hp normally aspirated flat-six engine. It impressed observers during the 24-hour race at the Nordschleife. The car--driven by ALMS GT champion Jörg Bergmeister, Richard Lietz, Marco Holzer and Martin Ragginger--led the race overall for more than eight hours before retiring with a blown engine with just one hour and 45 minutes remaining in the event. The failure struck some Porsche personnel as ironic, since they were concerned about the flywheel system's reliability, not the generally bulletproof 4.0-liter flat-six gasoline engine. Its entry at Petit means it will now get another crack at a significant endurance event. The race runs over a distance of 1,000 miles or a maximum of 10 hours.

"After the 911 GT3 R Hybrid's fantastic performance at the Nürburgring 24 Hours, we are now eager to gain more experience with the hybrid technology on a variety of racetracks," said Hartmut Kristen, head of Porsche Motorsport. "At the same time, we would like to show fans and customers in our most important markets how our 'race lab' performs under racing conditions."
