



May 30, 2010 Board Meeting Notes

We had a discussion of how we send and receive rsvp's and trying not to overlap the two systems - the type sent by Al vs. those sent by Andrew. One system does not give name and number attending for headcounts for reservations. Yet there is the ease of adding it to your Google calendar. We haven't found an easy way to gather a head count. Please bear with us.

We have determined that 99% of club emails get through to our members. However, there is always that small percent that get filtered by your provider. If you have questions about club correspondence, or if you need some computer mail delivery advice, please ask Andrew. He'd be happy to do a resend if you feel something may have gotten "lost".

Kodiak Jacks will be a bit of a challenge to get to with the road construction. (Reports were that road construction didn't stop about 35 enthusiasts from attending).

Andrew submitted the paperwork for the PCA National charity subsidy in early May. We are awaiting confirmation that it has hit our account before sending out any funds.

Charity recipients take note. We are going to take a more formal approach next year. This does not mean we are unhappy with current recipients. To request charitable contributions from FVR, please review and follow the policy on the club's web site. You are asked to submit a formal request for funds beginning next year. Submit it to the Board for review. This will allow us to get a better handle on requests and outlays so that the funds impact the most members.

Andrew took care of our "Incorporation" paperwork. We will need to keep closer tabs on this important document in the future.

We had a request for printed newsletters to be sent in the mail by 2 or 3 members who preferred to read hard copy vs. electronic copy. The board decision is to continue to attach the newsletter to an email to avoid newsletter printing expenses, postage, and labor. Again, if you have any issues with your email setup, Andrew will help. Other clubs sometimes just send a link in email as opposed to the whole file. This is another potential option. And, if you do not have a printer, newsletters can be easily printed at most public libraries.

FVR Region of the Year Application

The Fox Valley Region has received supportive praise from peer region members and leadership, in addition to complements from Porsche Club of America leadership to attest to the quality of the activities we as a group have planned and made a reality. Our Fall Tours are notable examples, having gained the attention and even the participation of PCA Treasurer, Ruben Ledesma in 2009.

In the spirit of putting ourselves to the test, the Fox Valley Region has submitted an application to PCA for the 2010 Ferry Porsche Trophy "Region of the Year Award." The first presentation of the Ferry Porsche Region of the Year award was at the sixth Parade in 1961. This award, sponsored by the Porsche factory and POAC (Porsche of America Corporation) in memory of Dr. Ferdinand (Ferry) Porsche is presented to the outstanding

Region of the year, and is often referred to as the "Region of the Year Award."

The selection of the award winning Region is based on growth, general improvement or maintenance of high standards in activities, meetings, newsletters, and adherence to, or the furtherance of, the objectives and ideals of the Porsche Club of America, Inc.

Recent recipients of the Region of the Year Award include: Roadrunner (2009), Nord Stern (2008), and San Diego (2007). The categorical evaluation process is based on the level of membership activity, membership growth, community activity, multi-region participation, and newsletter effectiveness.

To support the FVR submission for the Region of the Year Award, early in 2010 the document following this page was drafted and presented to the PCA National

Awards Chair. The document


The Fox Valley region (FV) is located in Zone 13, in the Upper Midwest of the United States. It covers more than 23,000 square miles of diverse topography, two time zones, two states, and some very rugged seasonal weather. Although we tend to garage our Porsches during the snowy and icy winter months, we are socially active year 'round.

The FV region was chartered almost 20 years ago, in 1990, developing from the Milwaukee Region. In 2009, FV region experienced positive growth in membership, percentage participation of its members in events, and number and variety of events offered. We have developed an expansive print and DVD library free of charge to our members; have a user-friendly website, and our newsletter, Whaletales, won an award at Parade 2009. Our region's President was chosen at the PCA's Most Outstanding Enthusiast of the



Year in 2009 as well. Furthermore, we actively network with our neighboring regions so our members are able to participate in Concours, driver's education, racing, and autocross events. We are very proud of our charity work. We provide both volunteer and monetary support for "Supermileage", an ultra-high fuel economy vehicle design competition for high-school age participants in connection with Fox Valley Technical College. FV region also donates money annually from fund raising events to the Multiple Sclerosis Chapter of Wisconsin.

Our mission statement, as posted on our website, states, "We are primarily a social and touring club, enjoying positive fellowship with other Porsche owners at a variety of non-competitive activities. We do not host driver's education, auto cross, Concours, or club racing, but some of our members do participate in these events with other regions. We believe in the highest standards of courtesy and safety on the road during our activities. Technical sessions and information are offered to help promote high standards of operation and maintenance of our vehicles. A mutually beneficial relationship exists between our region and the local Porsche dealership, enabling both parties to prosper. We also have many cooperative relationships

with other Porsche regions, exchanging ideas, information and participation in a variety of events. Additionally, we network with other auto and community service clubs when appropriate. Our region also helps support several local charities." In summary, we exist to learn, make friends, and have fun.

Our 2009 calendar was abundantly filled with a variety of 44 events spread throughout our region, making activities accessible to all members. In general the events could

be categorized as: dinner/socials (15), board of directors meeting (4), tech sessions (5), tours (5), charity (4), events with dealership (6), and cross-region interaction (5). The following is a summary:

January 6 - Annual dinner and board of directors meeting at O'Charley's restaurant in Appleton. Seventeen members attended.

April 22 - FV member and investment counselor, Fritz Wotruba, hosted a free dinner and seminar in Appleton. Fourteen members attended.

April 25 - One day driving tour and dinner in Wautoma, WI, hosted by John & Jeanne Strublic. In spite of rainy, windy, and cold weather, 16 members participated. A visit was also made to Vintage Vehicles, a business that restores classic cars, near Wautoma. A local newspaper reporter also stopped to interview a few of the members and a group photo was taken and published in a local newspaper. Dinner was held at a beautiful supper club to conclude the day. The Strublic's also donated several door prizes.

May 1-2 - Supermileage charity event. Every year, on the first weekend in May, our club is a major supporter of the Supermileage portion of the WEEVA Challenge at Fox Valley Technical College (FVTC) in Appleton. Boys and girls from Wisconsin, Minnesota, and Michigan participate in this two-day competition to see who can get the best mileage from their gas- or electric-driven cars and thus become winners. Each high school participating submits one or more entries in the competition. These vehicles are home-built and designed to obtain maximum mileage when making eight laps around the Wisconsin International Raceway track for gas-powered and timed portion for the electric. On the first eight-hour day, volunteers from our club helped with inspection of the cars at FVTC and on the second eight-hour day, we assisted at the competition. At the track, our members helped with weighing in of the gas allotted to each car, both before the competitors made their laps, and then again afterwards, to determine the amount of fuel used. The winner in 2009 was 426 mpg. Six members helped supervise. The satisfaction our members experience from working with the students is overwhelming. This event demonstrates that the next generation is very competitive and full of enthusiasm for improving themselves and our world. In addition to the 16+ man hours each donated by our volunteers, our region also contributed \$500 to the event for materials. A local newspaper also published photos of some of our members assisting at the event and an accompanying article was published.

The silent auction precisely closed at 9:30 PM. The large, three paneled banner of the 2009 Carrera S sold for \$120 and was single highest sales of the evening. Thanks to the meticulous accounting skills of our treasurer, Larry Rogers, the silent auction raised a grand total of \$1,579.

Our region was moribund almost two years ago. Our by-laws were out of date, attendance at events was diminishing; only a handful of events were offered, the board had not met in over a year, and we were losing more members than we were gaining. The past two years, especially in 2009, we have turned things around with great success. We have added new positions to our board (dealer liaisons and technical advisors), and have new members on the board as well. We have developed open communication and a mutually beneficial relationship with our local dealership that never existed before. We have one local dealership that has been in existence for about six years. Until 2009, we had virtually no relationship with the dealership. Our liaisons have spent much time and energy this year fostering a positive working relationship with the sales staff. During the early winter through late spring, the dealership is partially closed, open by appointment only.

To help support our charities, the dealership has donated, the large, three-paneled banners that decorate the showroom area to us when a new banner arrives. This year we had two banners. The first was raffled and raised over \$70 for charity. The second one was "sold" at the holiday party's silent auction for \$120. Nearly half of our members attended at least one event in 2009. We have Fox Valley Region logo wear available at two stores, and they will ship products to the members' residences. Additionally, we have distinctive name badges with either pin or magnet backs that members are encouraged to purchase and wear at all events. They are quite popular. We have an outstanding safety record at our events. We have never had to file a negative report or claim of any kind. We are always in full compliance with our insurance and safety paperwork. Lastly, whenever a member hosts an event for the first time, they receive an attractive matted and framed "Certificate of Appreciation" created and signed by the region's secretary, Mary Haen. The certificate features our

club's logo, the recipient's name and the words "On behalf of the membership in recognition of your participation and support of the programs of the Fox Valley Region, Porsche Club of America." They have become quite coveted and this certainly fosters members' willingness to host another event in the future.

Because we do not have the resources to host track events, we actively network with the Milwaukee, Chicago, and Central Wisconsin regions when they hold events at Blackhawk Farms and Road America. Our region is frequently invited by other surrounding areas such as the Autobahn, Gingerman and other events in Illinois and Michigan. It is our goal that in time we will have the personnel and funds to host something of our own in the future. We are also looking to have a cross-region Autocross with the Milwaukee region in 2010. Rallies have been attempted in the past with our region, but were not well-attended. However, we are planning two for 2010 as more interest has been expressed in this activity recently.

All of our communication is done electronically. We do, however, have a handful of members who do not have e-mail or internet. Our webmaster, Al Taylor, sends postcards to those members letting them know about our activities. Two of those members have started attending events, and one recently got a computer and couldn't wait to get his e-mail on the master list! He said he got the computer just for Porsche club events. Our technical advisor receives frequent news updates about Porsche. Several of these are forwarded to the membership. Many members have stated they appreciate all the great communication; especially those that are "up north" and feel separated from the rest of us. Electronic communication has helped to keep us a closely knit group.

Our newsletter editor traveled extensively for his career, quite often to Asia. He announced at the end of summer that he was resigning as editor as of the end of the year. New member, Mark Wilkinson, has volunteered to take over the position beginning in January. Mark has already spent a great deal of time reviewing the past 19 years of our region's newsletters, tracking down all issues and scanning them on to CD's and jump drives, plus internet searches of other regions' publications. We are confident Mark will take our newsletter to a new level in 2010.

We have a large Fox Valley Region banner that we proudly display at many of our outdoor events and often use as part of group photos. It was created and donated by our Vice-President/dealership liaison, Nick Proctor. A special, handmade "Welcome" banner with our region's logo on it was hung outside one of the restaurants we dined at during the fall tour. The owner/manager donated the banner to us afterwards. We were most honored to accept it. Furthermore, we have Porsche Club Worldwide flag on a telescoping flagpole with base that we display at our many events.

The club also purchased a standing portable Coleman gas grill (yes, it fits under the bonnet of a 911!) so we can continue our potluck picnics and cook-outs in the dealership parking lot or other locations where grills might not be available.

We had three articles in the "From the Regions" section of Panorama published in 2009: the ladies' tour, the September 5 picnic with the Milwaukee region, and our fall tour group photo with accompanying narrative.

The club's president takes a lot of photos at each event. Copies of those photos are quickly sent to the members who are subjects of those photos, along with a thank you note for participating/attending. Members have expressed appreciation for this and it fosters further attendance at future events.

Our holiday party has gained a very popular reputation. In October, our region's President and long-time holiday hostess, was contacted by the holiday party chairperson for the Lincoln Trail Region at the recommendation of our Zone Representative, Ken Hold. LTR was seeking ways to "liven up" their party and increase attendance, and our holiday party was given as a model as a means to accomplish those goals. Our President was able to assist the LTR with several creative suggestions.

Bill & Linda Bein, along with some other members, have frequently donated tickets to the region for events at Road America. These tickets have been auctioned or raffled throughout the spring and early summer. Funds raised are then donated to our charities.

Our region's President initiated and continues to collect recipes to assemble a Best of the Best Fox Valley Region PCA Cookbook. The region has obviously had multiple successful potlucks this past year and there were many delicious appetizers, salads, desserts, casseroles, etc. at each one. Members have been asked to contribute their favorite recipes. When the cook book is completed in 2010, it will be available for sale and the profits will be donated to our charities as well.

We began 2009 with 138 primary members and total of 258 members. We concluded with 153 primary members, for a grand total of 281 members. This is the largest number of members ever in the FV region. We gained 32 new primary members, four of whom transferred from the Central Wisconsin Region. Ninety percent of our members renewed their memberships. We lost two members to transfer out of state, both of which were career related. Of the 10% of members that did not renew, and responded to inquiries about their non-renewal, no one indicated dissatisfaction with the club as their reason for non-renewal. Economic reasons, (costs of car, change/loss of job, not enough time to participate in activities) were the common reasons given. Much of Wisconsin and Upper Michigan has experienced

approximately 12% unemployment (or higher in some localized areas), so the downturn of the economy has affected many, and the Porsche was a casualty of financial circumstances.

Our club is promoted through events at our local dealership (coffee and doughnuts, picnic, tech sessions); a FV region brochure designed by our dealer liaisons, our a user-friendly website, business cards, newspaper articles about activities of our club, sharing of our newsletter at the dealership, and of course word of mouth from our enthusiastic members.

Upon joining, new members receive a welcome letter from our President, a copy of the current newsletter, and at least one board member calls and welcomes them. They are given a "mentor" for the first year and/or events they attend. Upon attending their first event, they receive a PCA logo lapel pin. They are also asked to share their biography in the next edition of our newsletter. One-fourth of our new members have volunteered to host an event or took on additional responsibilities with the club in 2009.

Whaletales, our newsletter, is published monthly and continues to be upgraded often. It earned a 2nd place in its class at the 2009 Parade. The newsletter contains at least one member biography so members can become more acquainted with one another and network. The first quarter of the year also held a trivia contest, with the prize being a gift certificate towards the spring opener dinner. Several members have not been able to attend events competed in the contest electronically. They were excited to be able to "participate" in a FV region activity in this manner. We have little advertising in our newsletter, so of the 50 or so pages sometimes published, nearly all of it is informational text or photos of active members. In 2009, the twelve issues of Whaletales totaled 41.4 MB or an average of 3.5 MB per issue which translates into 551 pages or 45.9 pages per issue.

The FV region's website, fv.pca.org is a user-friendly and informational website. Users can read our by-laws and charity guidelines, peruse current and past newsletters, view a photo gallery, check our region's calendar of events, and easily access the PCA website as well. Additionally, our events are posted on the pca.org, Porsche Clubs Worldwide, and Grassroots Motorsports websites.

Our technical advisor sent a survey to all members in October. Forty-one replies were received. Answers to questions about satisfaction with the club, meeting members' needs, etc. were all highly positive. Some responses indicated an interest in a rally or autocross, and more technical sessions. We are building those events into the 2010 calendar.

The region's library contains nearly 300 print and digital items and is housed at the Auto Clinic in Neenah, WI at

the business of membership chair/V.P-elect. Items are checked out on the honor system and can be returned at any time. We have never "lost" an item to date. In general, the region spends about \$200 per year on new materials. Our librarian/archivist, Jim Haen, has done a diligent job for over twelve years. With some additional support from new member and newsletter editor, Mark Wilkinson, all nineteen years of newsletters are now on file, both in paper and digital forms, including jump drives.

We have several members who are "snow birds" and spend many of the winter months in FL. Many of them are active in the local regions there as they take their Fox Valley Region enthusiasm with them (Space Coast, Gold Coast, Everglades). One couple has volunteered to work in the timing and scoring tower for the 48 hours of Sebring for many consecutive years. We additionally have members who are active the Wisconsin 356 club, and the Concours D'Elegance with the Milwaukee region. Our region was also again invited to participate and show our cars in the 7th Annual Oktoberfest and German car show held in Chippewa Falls, WI, the third weekend in September. The by-laws from the FV region, updated in July 2008. were shared with the Bluegrass and Southern Indiana Regions, at their request. These clubs were reviewing their documents and asked for a copy of our region's by-laws as a model to follow.

The FV region has indicated interest in hosting a National Board Meeting and an Executive Council Meeting the past two years. As of this writing, no one has taken us up on our offer, but we would be most honored to host either one of your meetings in our region.

Prior to the close of 2009, the Fox Valley Region developed a very full and varied calendar of more than 30 events for 2010. These include, but are not limited to: First Tuesday of each month dinner socials (some include parking lot car shows), dinner and a movie night, Supermileage and Fox Valley Road & Track Classic charity events, two tech sessions with Chuck James (to be held at the dealership), a bus trip to the Chicago Auto Show and the Porsche

Exchange, a spring waterfalls tour to Upper Michigan, Kettle Moraine state parks tour, Ladies' Only tour to Door County, Iola Car show tour and potluck social, "Lap around Lake Winnebago" tour, 20th Anniversary celebration at Trout Springs Winery, Motorhead Picnic and rally with a motorcycle group from Chicago (including live music and a pig roast), a free picnic at the dealership, fall tour to southwestern WI, tech session at the Auto Clinic, Garage Taj Mahal tour (visit members' garages with lots of gadgets and interesting capabilities), "show & tell" dinner, rally in Keshena, at least five Saturday morning coffee and doughnut socials at the dealership, and the holiday party

The Fox Valley Region is deserving of the Ferry Porsche Trophy for multiple reasons. Two years ago, our region was struggling to survive. 2008 was a year of re-building and revitalizing, and 2009 was a year of great growth and forward movement. While we are relatively small and live in a sometimes Porsche-hostile climate, we are highly active twelve months of the year. Our members are passionate about their cars, and their enthusiasm is infectious. We absolutely exemplify "It's the people, not the cars" philosophy. The camaraderie amongst our members is truly remarkable and unique. Guests, visitors, and new members are always impressed with the friendliness and warmth of our club members. Families, including children, are always welcome. We have made tremendous strides in the past year with attracting new members, retention of members, number and variety of events, responsiveness to members' needs, keeping members informed of current events in Porsche news, spreading out our activities to all areas of our region, the quality of our newsletters and website, efforts of marketing, increase of attendance and participation at events, significant increase in the number of members volunteering to host events, charitable work and financial donations, consistent high levels of safety, increased level of communication, distinguished awards earned by two members at the 2009 Parade, use of banners to display our pride and presence at outdoor events, initiation and participation in cross-regional events, and mutually beneficial relationship with the local Porsche dealership.


