

Call of the Wild: Laura Prellwitz

It has been included in this month's Whaletales to emphasize the positive recognition that the Fox Valley Region and its membership have received at the national level from PCA. - Whaletales editor, Mark Wilkinson



she didn't think she had "a snowball's chance" of being chosen. Though the award shouldn't have come as a surprise: Fox Valley had named her their Enthusiast of the Year for 2003 and 2007 as well as Member of the Year for 2008 and 2009.

Described as "part den mother, part chocolate goddess." Prellwitz wielded her instinct for leadership, guiding Fox Valley toward the excellence she knew it could achieve. Members joked that her nurturing management style was more reminiscent of a den mother than a stuffed-shirt executive.

"I never once followed "Roberts Rules of Order at a meeting," Prellwitz recalls. "We did everything through respectful conversation and made decisions by consensus. But even through or cars were in storage during the dead of winter, that was no excuse for non-participation. There were a good many talented individuals holding back in our region. I had to straighten out our membership email list and make phone calls and get folks involved. People told me I breathed life back into the club; and with the support of some hard-working and dedicated board and general members, we turned things around. I pushed a few people beyond their comfort zones, but as they experienced success or momentum quickly built."

Prellwitz assumed the presidency upon receiving-without her knowledge--four write-in votes: the most by any candidate. Soon after she took the reins, Fox Valley's VP resigned. Mama Bear sent out an email SOS to their membership and Nick Proctor, who'd joined in 1998 and, according to Prellwitz, "never participated in

anything," immediately volunteered for the post. Mama Bear accepted his offer but remained puzzled "why he suddenly came out of the woodwork after ten years." When pressed for an explanation, Proctor indicates he was favorably impressed with what Prellwitz had accomplished in her first few weeks: "I had the privilege of serving as vice president with Laura, someone with vision, enthusiasm, and creativity," says Proctor. "She is a force to be reckoned with and revived our club from a moribund status in 2007. She established extremely active and enjoyable events. She created an atmosphere of fun and extended family that didn't exist before. Once her energy got started, it spread through the club like wildfire."

Fox Valley, which grew from 131 members in 2007 to 153 in 2009, boasted substantially increased participation last year in all of its 44 events, encompassing areas of Wisconsin and Upper Michigan. They have as many events planned for 2010. Contrast this with 2006, when customary attendance was in single digits, resulting in the cancellation of some events.

"I worked very hard to offer a wide variety of activities in a myriad of locations to make things of interest accessible to all members," says Prellwitz, who was concerned not only with growth but ensuring that the growth was sustainable. "If I had to name my strongest skill, it would be long-range planning and getting others involved in those plans. I am always cognizant that everyone is a volunteer. I wanted to make sure that every time someone came to an event they had a quality experience so they would want to come back again, perhaps someday take on a leadership role. People join PCA for diverse reasons, quite often very different from my own, but those reasons are just as important and deserve equal consideration."

To explain how such famine-to-feast conditions evolved within Fox Valley Region, we must backtrack.

On her first date in 1983 with Jamie Prellwitz, who later would become her husband, Mama Bear recalls his driving "a Datsun 280Z, which he kept referring to as his 'Japanese Porsche.'" Jamie, at age 40, finally realized his lifelong dream and bought a black 1987 911 coupe. At his wife's urging, they joined PCA to do more things together with the car though Prellwitz was bothered that attendees at Fox Valley events were 90 percent male. Women, she says, seemed to feel intimidated ("Ooh, this

car's too powerfuL") or else to think that they were not mechanically inclined.

When Prellwitz, with the support of others, increased the presence of women at the region's events, "Men realized if their wives or girlfriends came along and had a good time, they themselves would get to drive their Porsches more."

Prellwitz also was baffled during earlier days when only two females drove in their region's road tours. So in 2009 she launched their first all-women's tour, attracting 17 attendees: "We drove through Door County with splendid scenery of Lake Michigan, and everyone requested to do it again this year and include a tour of a lighthouse," reports Prellwitz, a passionate collector of miniature lighthouses.

"We enjoyed driving the cars, stopping at a winery and a farmers' market, and ending up at one participant's cottage," she recalls. "This participant's husband was onsite, walking around, carrying a purse to 'fit in.' Another member owned a gift shop en route. He cleared out the parking lot and set up a 'bar' with a Porsche flag, mimosas, and chocolate brownies. We were definitely noticed by passers-by."

A lifelong sailor and equestrian, Prellwitz once triedin a manner of speaking-to run with the wolves. She participated in a 2007 Boundary Waters canoe trip through the Ely, Minnesota, International Wolf Center led by "hard core" guides. Prellwitz found herself awestruck by the wolves' beauty, intelligence, and sensitivity to their environment and witnessed a howling session during which the animals' voices, body language, stance, etc., communicated a message to the rest of the pack. The tour group would paddle/ portage by day and one night witnessed the Perseid meteor shower. They tracked collared wolves through radio telemetry and observed "Bald eagles, beavers rearranging the landscape, and a moose swimming by," says Prellwitz. "We even practiced howling but received some rather questionable howls in response."

Prellwitz entered their 911 at a car show for the Makea-Wish Foundation and maintains that the Porsche mystique can be a powerful learning tool. Two years ago at Road America, she was packing up at the end of a day at Porsche Park when "another P-car pulled up, driven by a gentlemen in his 30's accompanied by two little boys.

One shouted, 'Dad! Look! There's a girl and girls can drive Porsches!' We never knew that perception was still out there, especially among kids."

Prellwitz, who holds a master's degree in teacher leadership, is a sixth-grade language arts teacher and occasionally drives her Porsche to school as "a cool way to connect with kids." While serving in an earlier position, teaching special education, she taught one kid who wasn't participating but "who had a lot goodness in him. I told him the unexcused absences had to stop. We wrote out and signed a contract. The deal was, on the last day of school, I would take him out in the Porsche, drive by his friend's house and honk the horn, then eat lunch at McDonald's. He shaped up."

Prellwitz's current classroom has three big windows.

On certain mornings, she'll write on the chalkboard "The Porsche is here" and students will run to the windows and beg to be let out early to look at the car: "Even some of the girls have started getting into it."

Fox Valley Region also honored Prellwitz and her husband in 2009 with a Grand Achievement Award:

a beautifully inscribed Herman Miller clock. However, Mama Bear isn't sitting on her laurels, wasting time. She serves as the region's membership chair and contributing photographer. She's also creating Best of the Best: a Fox Valley Region PCA Cookbook with proceeds from the project to be donated to such causes as the Multiple Sclerosis Foundation of Wisconsin.

Reflecting on her T-shirt philosophy, "Climb Beyond Your Limitations," Prellwitz says "Having never been an officer in any club prior, much less a prestigious and well-organized national group like PCA, I initially felt totally overwhelmed when I accepted the role of president with my region. I relied on my classroom teaching background to get me organized, as that is what felt natural and comfortable. Just as in my classes, all members needed to feel welcomed, be successful when they sponsored or participated in an activity, and be appreciated whenever they contributed something positive to the group. I have three rules at school:

We're here to learn, make friends, and have fun. I applied those same principles to our club, and it had a very positive impact and outcome. We all have the same needs, whether we're 12 or 112.

Dealer Liason Update

On Saturday April 17th, Porsche of the Fox Valley moved from their original building over to the nearby Bergstrom Premier dealership building (two buildings away in the Bergstrom complex) This is to consolidate and maximize Porsche sales, guest services and parts in one convenient location.

Changes to the signs on the Premier dealership building are being changed to include Porsche signage. The phone numbers and e-mail remain the same for Porsche of the Fox Valley. Until the Premier building signs are changed, Porsche service will be housed in the entry bay that has the sign "Volvo" over the two bay doors (and are no longer at Enterprise Motors.)

As a separate matter, Paul Ellsworth, Manager of Porsche of the Fox Valley, has agreed to fund a one year membership in PCA to purchasers of new Porsches. This is a reflection of our continual strengthening of our club liaison efforts with Paul.

Finally, it is important to note that their remaining new 2009 Porsches have just now been aggressively priced in anticipation of the arrival of the 2011 Porsches in the near future. This is an opportunity for a whale of a deal on one of these 2009 Porsches. The models and new prices are now available on their website.

Porsche AG, Stuttgart, resolved not only changes in membership on the Supervisory Board, but also an increase in the number of Board Members to 20 Members in all. There are no changes, however, at the top of the Supervisory Board, Dr. Wolfgang Porsche being unanimously reelected as the Chairman and Uwe Hück as his Deputy.

New Members of the Board are Prof. Dr. Martin Winterkorn, Chairman of the Board of Management of Volkswagen AG and the Chairman of the Board of Management of Porsche Automobil Holding SE, Hans Dieter Pötsch, Member of the Board of Management of Volkswagen AG and Member of the Board of Management of Porsche Automobil Holding SE, Dr. Francisco Javier Garcia Sanz, Member of the Board of Management of Volkswagen AG, Christian Klingler, Member of the Board of Management of Volkswagen AG, and Prof. Dr. Horst Neumann, Member of the Board of Management of Volkswagen AG. Ferdinand Piëch jr., Prof. Dr. Ulrich Lehner, and Josef Ahorner are no longer on the Supervisory Board of Porsche AG.

Central Indiana Region is hosting the 1st annual Pole Day at Putnam Park Performance Driver Education event at Putnam Park Road Course in Mt. Meridian, Indiana. Putnam Park was built in 1991 and Central Indiana Region PCA was one of the first groups to utilize the excellent circuit for high performance driver education and club racing events.

The track is a 1.8-mile long, ten-turn road course with an excellent layout. The entire course can be seen from the pit area. Because the track is relatively flat, has high visibility with plenty of run off room, it makes a terrific place to begin your high performance driving experience. It's great for experienced drivers as well and offers positive and negative camber corners, several high speed corners and a down hill main straight.

Putnam Park is 40 miles west of Indianapolis, just off I-70 near Cloverdale. Weather can be turn rapidly this time of year so please come prepared. We are looking forward to a great weekend of performance driving and sharing good times with old and new friends.

Less experienced drivers will have an instructor riding with them on-track until the driver is comfortable with the course and the car. There will be four run groups and an instructor group to better match students of similar abilities in the same session. Run Group A will be for very experienced drivers in higher performance cars. Group B will be for experienced drivers new to Putnam Park or driving medium performance cars. Group C will be for student drivers with some experience and Group D will be for student drivers with little or no experience. There will also be scheduled classroom instruction/discussion sessions to discuss aspects of high performance driving with plenty of time for questions and answers. This is an excellent time to learn more about your car's capabilities and enhance your driving skills. Join us for a great weekend of "unwipable" smiles and become a better driver on and off the track.

Event headquarters will be the Baymont Inn, 6010 Gateway Drive, Plainfield, IN 46168 (317) 837-9000. A block of rooms at a special Central Indiana Porsche Club rate have been held. Make sure you mention the Central Indiana Porsche Club to get the special rate. Event check-in will be held Friday evening at the Baymont Inn with early technical inspection and registration available. We'll even provide some finger food for you to snack on while you catch up with old and new friends.

General Requirements:

- 1. Helmets 2000 or later Snell Special Application rating (SA00, SA05 or SA10) required. Snell motorcycle helmets (M00, M05) or non-Snell rated helmets will NOT be permitted. Snell certification can be found inside your helmet, under the liner, at the back check before you arrive!
- 2. Seatbelts driver and passenger minimum 3-point (harness preferred).
- 3. For Student drivers the passenger seat and seatbelts must be equivalent to the driver's seat/seat belts.
- 4. Convertibles with factory installed roll bars will be permitted. For all other convertibles a roll bar that meets the "broomstick" test is required.
- 5. While on track driver window will be fully down (rain or shine), sunroofs fully closed, Targa tops must be installed.
- 6. Minimum 3/32" tire depth or visible tread all the way across the tire.
- 7. Long sleeve cotton shirt, natural fiber long pants (or driving suit), and shoes with leather or canvas uppers are required.
- 8. Valid driver's license (must show at registration), 18 years or older.
- 9. No open exhausts.
- 10. Drivers are responsible for the preparation and safety of their cars. You will receive a technical inspection checklist, which must be completed and signed prior to the event. It is recommended that a competent mechanic perform the inspection. All vehicles will be inspected and must pass a basic safety check at the event prior to running.
- 11. Entrants will be required to provide their own car numbers. Numbers should be at least 8 inches tall and of contrasting color. A limited quantity of magnetic numbers will be available for purchase at tech inspection for \$30 a set. No vehicle will be allowed on track without a Group sticker and car number.

American Le Mans Series, ALMS Long Beach, Race report

Porsche Outlasts BMW, Ferrari, Corvette to Win ALMS Long Beach GT - Flying Lizard Porsche Long/Bergmeister Grab ALMS Long Beach GT Win and Tie for First in Point Standings; Graf/Pickett on Podium Again in Muscle Milk RS Spyder

LONG BEACH, Calif - April 17 - The Flying Lizard Motorsports Porsche 911 GT3 RSR team had so much confidence in their over-the-wall pit crew that they elected to take on four new tires - even though their closest competitors tried to save time by not changing tires - and their strategy paid off as Patrick Long (USA) and Joerg Bergmeister (Germany) scored an exciting GT class win at today's American Le Mans Series event at Long Beach.

Long and Bergmeister, the defending ALMS GT champions, were determined to rebound from a disappointing fourth-place finish at Sebring, and outlasted both the BMWs and Ferraris at Long Beach to vault themselves into a share of first place driver points after two events.

"Because this was the second event of the two-race probation for me from Laguna last year, the team decided

it would be better for me to drive the first stint," said Bergmeister, "but it was the quick driver and tire change at our pit stop, plus Patrick's amazing pressure on the BMW, that gave us the victory."

"I was able to get right on the tail of the #92 BMW after the pit stop with my new tires because we almost beat the BMW out of the pits, even though they did not change tires," explained Long, who rode the bumper of the BMW and passed Tommy Milner with only ten minutes to go in the race.

"I had a little trouble at first because we failed to adjust the seat during the driver change, and since Joerg is almost a foot taller than I am, I was barely reaching the pedals until the first yellow flag of my stint. After that, I realized that, with the better tires, that, when I made the pass, I could make it stick. Then I noticed the Ferrari and Corvette were closing, and I needed to get more

aggressive. There were a couple points of contact, and I passed him with two wheels off in the dirt. What a race!" said Long.

The Magnussen/O'Connell Corvette was second, and the Auberlen/Milner BMW third.

Henzler takes Early Lead

As the green flag dropped, Wolf Henzler (Germany), the driver who had put the Team Falken Tire Porsche 911 GT3 RSR on the front row of the GT grid, did exactly what he did at Sebring - out-accelerate the pole-sitting Ferrari to take first place. He held onto the top spot for his entire stint, out-gunning the competition in the corners and keeping them behind him on the straight-aways. Traffic in the pits caused them to lose several positions during their driver change, and he and co-driver Bryan Sellers (USA) finished sixth.

"Our goal was to have a better finish than Sebring, where we knew the car was fast, but we did not have a great result. We definitely achieved that goal with our sixth-place finish, but we know we had a car that could have easily finished on the podium. We showed that we could run with the leaders in GT, and we look forward to a top finish in a few weeks at Laguna Seca," said Henzler, the 2008 ALMS GT champion with Bergmeister.

LMP and GTC

In the overall battle among the newly-merged prototype class entries, Klaus Graf (Germany) and Greg Pickett (USA) ran in the top three in the overall event with the Muscle Milk Porsche RS Spyder for the whole race, finishing third behind two former LMP1 cars with their LMP2 racer. Further refinement of the LMP rules could result in an overall victory for the Porsche RS Spyder -

owner of 11 such wins - before the end of the season.

Butch Leitzinger (USA) and Juan Gonzales (Mexico) won their second straight ALMS GT Challenge in the Alex Job Racing Mission Foods Porsche 911 GT3 RSR when the team Alex Job Porsche, the Battery Tender entry of Bill Sweedler/Romeo Kapudija, got slightly off line and spun while leading the class with four minutes to go. Leitzinger, a veteran of late-race drama, was pleased to take home the win.

"The combination of these strong Porsche 911 GT3 Cup cars and Alex Job's careful preparation and execution of a race plan make it fun to be with this team. I miss running the prototypes, but it is the team, not the car, that completes the experience. I have spent a lot of my career with a great team - Dyson Racing, and this experience with Alex Job is turning out great as well," said Leitzinger.

Michelin Green X Challenge

To round out a successful weekend for Porsche Motorsport, both the #6 Muscle Milk Porsche RS Spyder (LMP) and the #45 Flying Lizard Porsche 911 GT3 RSR (GT) earned the Michelin Green X Challenge award, the first time Porsche has swept that honor for both categories. Both cars earned Michelin's best Green Achievement scores from a formula which measures performance efficiency, greenhouse gas emissions, and petroleum displacement for both LMP and GT classes.

"It is unbelievable for us to not only win the Long Beach race but the Michelin Green X Challenge, as well, by being both efficient and green," said Patrick Long, codriver with Joerg Bergmeister of the GT category winning #45 Flying Lizard Porsche. "We are proud to be with a series, a manufacturer and a team that wants to lead the fight to show that it can be cool to be green and fast."


