

Stuttgart. Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche AG, Stuttgart, is mourning Professor Ferdinand Alexander Porsche. The Honorary President of the Supervisory Board died on 5 April 2012 in Salzburg, aged 76. Matthias Müller, President and Chief Executive Officer of Porsche AG, paid tribute to Ferdinand Alexander Porsche's services to the sports car manufacturer: "We mourn the death of our partner, Ferdinand Alexander Porsche. As the creator of the Porsche 911, he established a design culture in our company that has shaped our sports cars to this very day. His philosophy of good design is a legacy to us that we will honour for all time."

Ferdinand Alexander Porsche was born in Stuttgart on 11 December 1935, the oldest son of Dorothea and Ferry Porsche. Even his childhood was shaped by cars, and he spent much of his time in the engineering offices and development workshops of his grandfather Ferdinand Porsche. In 1943 the family accompanied the Porsche company's move to Austria, where he went to school in Zell am See. After returning to Stuttgart in 1950, he attended the private Waldorf school. After leaving school, he enrolled at the prestigious Ulm School of Design.

In 1958, F.A. Porsche, as he was known by his colleagues, joined the engineering office of what was then Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche KG. He soon proved his great talent for design by sculpting the first model of a successor to the 356 model line out of plasticine. In 1962 he took over as head of the Porsche design studio, creating a worldwide furore one year later with the Porsche 901 (or 911). With the Porsche 911, F.A. Porsche created a sports car icon whose timeless and classical form survives to this very day in what is now the seventh 911 generation. However, in addition to passenger cars, F.A. Porsche also concerned himself with designing the sports cars of the 1960s. His best-known designs include the Type 804 Formula One racing car or the Porsche 904 Carrera GTS, now considered to be one of the most beautiful racing cars ever.

In the course of the conversion of Porsche KG into a joint-stock corporation in 1971/72, Ferdinand Alexander Porsche, along with all the other family members, stood down from the company's front-line business operations. In 1972 he founded the "Porsche Design Studio" in Stuttgart, the head office of which was relocated to Zell am See in Austria in

1974. In the decades that followed, he designed numerous classic gentlemen's accessories such as watches, spectacles and writing implements that achieved global recognition under the "Porsche Design" brand. In parallel, with his team, he designed a plethora of industrial products, household appliances and consumer durables for internationally renowned clients under the brand "Design by F.A. Porsche". A strong and clear design concept typifies all product designs created in his design studio to date. The credo of his design work was: "Design must be functional and functionality has to be translated visually into aesthetics, without gags that have to be explained first." F.A. Porsche: "A coherently designed product requires no adornment; it should be enhanced by its form alone." The design's appearance should be readily comprehensible and not detract from the product and its function. His conviction was: "Good design should be honest."

Ferdinand Alexander Porsche received numerous honours and awards both for his work as a designer as well as for individual designs. For example, in 1968 the "Comité Internationale de Promotion et de Prestige" honoured him for the outstanding aesthetic design of the Porsche 911 while the Industrial Forum Design Hannover (iF) voted him "Prizewinner of the Year" in 1992. In 1999, the President of Austria bestowed on him the title of Professor.

Ferdinand Alexander Porsche retained a close lifelong association with Porsche AG as a partner and member of the Supervisory Board. For example, even after stepping down from front-line business operations, he contributed to the design of Porsche's sports cars over many decades and repeatedly steered the company in the right di-rection. This was especially the case for the difficult period Porsche experienced at the beginning of the 1990s. From 1990 to 1993, F.A. Porsche served as President of the company's Supervisory Board, thus playing a major role in Porsche A.G's eco-nomic turnaround. In 2005, he stood down from his Supervisory Board role in favour of his son Oliver and assumed the mantle of Honorary President of the Supervisory Board.

Ferdinand Alexander Porsche will be buried in the family grave at Schüttgut in Zell am See, attended by his immediate family. An official funeral service will be held in Stuttgart at a later date.

# World Endurance Championship

World Endurance Championship, round 2 in Spa-Francorchamps, Belgium

Porsche pilots look forward to a very special challenge

Stuttgart. On the storied Spa-Francorchamps race track in Belgium round two of the World Endurance Championship is held on 5th May. Porsche works drivers Marc Lieb (Germany) and Richard Lietz (Austria) contest the LMGTE Pro class at the wheel of Felbermayr-Proton's Porsche 911 GT3 RSR. At the season-opening race in Sebring/USA, the pair finished in second and with this celebrated a great start into the new long distance world championship.

The race: Spa-Francorchamps is one of the classic venues on the calendar of the new World Endurance Championship. The race runs over six hours like all other rounds except the twelve hour race in Sebring and the Le Mans 24 hour race.

The circuit: The 7.004 kilometre Circuit Spa-Francorchamps is one of the most interesting and demanding race tracks in the world. 1954 marked the first sports car race to run on the Ardennes track which stands for fascinating motorsport history with triumphs and tragedies. Spa-Francorchamps is most famous for its daunting Eau Rouge corner.

The Porsche drivers: Porsche works drivers Marc Lieb and Richard Lietz contest the GTE Pro class at the wheel of Felbermayr-Proton's Porsche 911 GT3 RSR. Christian Ried (Germany), Porsche Cup winner Gianluca Roda (Italy) and Paolo Ruberti (Italy) are keen to repeat their victory from Sebring in the GTE Am class, where only last year's cars and one professional race driver per vehicle are permitted. The Porsche 911 GT3 RSR of Ried and Roda is also entered by Felbermayr-Proton.

# World Endurance Championship

The Porsche 911 GT3 RSR: As the top model of Porsche Motorsport's customer racing vehicles, the Porsche 911 GT3 RSR headed into the 2012 racing season with extensive modifications. Particularly noticeable is the widening of the body by 48 millimetres. The aero kit is supplemented by a new intake air ducting. The particularly efficient six-cylinder boxer engine generates 460 hp (338 kW) with a mandatory air restrictor and drives the 310 millimetre wide rear wheels. The diameter of the front wheels has increased to 680 millimetres.

Porsche successes: On the Circuit Spa-Francorchamps Porsche celebrated not only endurance wins in the glorious seventies and eighties but also in the modern era. In 2006 and 2007, Marc Lieb won the sports car class with the Porsche 911 GT3 RSR. In 2009 and 2010, he and Richard Lietz secured two more class wins in the Le Mans Series. In 2003, Lieb claimed overall victory at the Spa 24 Hours with Porsche, and followed up with GT class wins in 2005 and 2007. The Porsche RS Spyder was successful in Belgium, too: In 2008 and 2009, the sports prototype from Weissach clinched LMP2 class honours.

The schedule: The six-hour race in Spa-Francorchamps starts on Saturday, 5 May, at 14.30 hrs. Eurosport 2 broadcasts the race live from 19.00 to 20.30 hrs, Eurosport televises highlights on 9 May from 00.00 to 01.00 hrs.

Comments before the race: Hartmut Kristen, Porsche Head of Motorsport: "The new World Endurance Championship began very well in Sebring for our Felbermayr-Proton team. With this performance the squad will also hold their own in Spa-Francorchamps, although the opposition will be even stronger. The Ardennes race track is closely tied to historic Porsche endurance racing successes. It's a very demanding challenge that our works drivers Marc Lieb and Richard Lietz have already mastered extremely well with class victories in the Porsche 911 GT3 RSR in the past years." Marc Lieb: "I'm looking forward to contesting the new World Endurance Championship in Spa. Aside from the Nürburgring-Nordschleife, the Spa circuit is my absolute favourite. The track is flowing and very challenging, not to mention the fantastic corners. It's simply great fun to drive the 911 GT3 RSR there. We made a great start to the season in Sebring and now we want to continue in the same vein. I'm feeling very confident that we'll manage it." Richard Lietz: "I really like the circuit and Marc is one of the Spa specialists, so for that reason alone I'm feeling very optimistic about this race. We know we can be fast with the new 911 GT3 RSR. Our second place in Sebring has put us in a good position for the rest of the season. The race in Spa runs over six hours, in Sebring we led for six hours - perhaps that's a good omen."

The World Endurance Championship: Sports prototypes and GT vehicles race in the new World Endurance Championship. They are divided into four classes that start together but are classified separately:

- LMGTE Pro class: This class is reserved for slightly modified standard sports cars with 440 to 500 hp and a minimum weight of 1,245 kilograms (e.g. Porsche 911 GT3 RSR).
- LMGTE Am class: Like the LMGTE Pro, but the regulations stipulate that only last year's cars are eligible and there must be no more than one professional driver per vehicle.
- LMP1 class: Sports prototypes with up to 550 hp and a minimum weight of 900 kilograms.
- LMP2 class: Sports prototypes with around 440 hp and a 900 kilogram minimum weight.



#### Customer Service redefined.

As most of you probably know, I bought a really nice, used, great running 2004 Porsche Cayenne S with 60K miles from a private party last fall. The first thing I do when I buy a used car is change the spark plugs, change air & oil filters, change the oil, etc. During the course of changing plugs, I noticed that 7 out of 8 of the ignition coils were visibly cracked. Oh no. An emergency trip from Green Bay to Bergstrom Porsche Fox Valley in Appleton in the wife's car... and about \$456.00 later (\$55 each x 8 plus tax), I had new ignition coils. I was heartbroken. I installed my new spark plugs and mating coils, reassembled the facia, gritted my teeth and took a ride. The car performed beautifully, exactly the same as before, only now cost \$500 more! My experience is that any factory ignition coil generally last nearly the lifetime of the vehicle, and are not typical wear & tear items. The folks at Bergstrom encouraged me to write a letter to Porsche Cars North America and plead for "goodwill assistance". My letter was short and concise, questioning the premature failure of the original Porsche parts, and humbly asking for reimbursement of perhaps "half" of the cost of these parts (I thought that might be a fair request). Remember, this is a used car, not under any warranty program, bought from a private party. Cutting ahead to April, I just received a check from Porsche Customer Commitment for the full \$456.00 I paid for the ignition coils including the tax! Now THAT is great service above and beyond the call of duty. Try that at your Ford dealer! I guess Porsche has got a customer for life. This has provided the best advertising Porsche could imagine. Just thought you'd all like to know. Thank you Porsche Cars North America in Atlanta, and thank you Bergstrom Appleton.
