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

From the President

Finally the details of the new 911 have been released. And again I say WOW what engineering. As many of you know I am quite intrigued by quality engineering, something many manufacturers I feel today have forgotten about. In a world of plastic, speed of production, and meeting profit margins most companies forgo the extra quality craftsmanship of a product, but this new 911 like its predecessors, breaks the mold of normality. I have to say what a defining moment yet again for a car manufacturer.

This morning as I watched CBS Sunday Morning I was reminded about our brain's pleasure sensors. Areas of the brain that are chemically excited by different activities both by action and reaction. The comment the host had made better defined an example of pleasure, for many of us that of driving a Porsche. At that age I had no idea of the difference or the horsepower that I was experiencing.

Armand asked if I would like to drive (Roughly translated by my grandfather) to which I sheepishly said I don't have a license yet, let alone a license in Belgium. He then said to take the wheel and again I recalled the different power and feeling of driving this car. Lastly he said as we traveled at approximately 130 Km/h let go of the wheel and hang on. He mashed his foot on the brake and the car gracefully came to a jolting stop dead straight on the small country path. That moment there is what gave me the bug! A moment that is defining in life where you feel the passion, understand the work, time, and emotion that goes into making a product. A product as technically astonishing as automobiles are. From that point on in life I looked at products and engineering a bit different.

I enjoyed my first Volkswagens, Mercedes, and Audis, but none have gotten the pleasure synopses firing quite like Porsche. My first Porsche experience was quite the ride as well, and very defining when it comes to driving cars. I recently had the pleasure of driving a Porsche Club member's 912 on the fall tour/rally this year, this same emotion and feeling was overwhelming. For every 356, 912, 944, 911, GT3, and yes even a Cayenne this experience and pleasure are what keeps me coming back to a brand. The general tour route will be a departure Friday, September 14, at 10:30AM from the north side of Green Bay to Wallace, MI, with a stop at the DeYoung Family Zoo. From there we will travel to our final destination, Manistique, MI. Or, you may drive up on your at your leisure and we'll meet you when you arrive.

On Saturday, you will have three options of driving tours; from minimal, to moderate, to long-distance hard core (traveling to the town of Paradise and Whitefish Point, coming within 17 miles of where the Edmund Fitzgerald sank in 1975). You will have several choices on Saturday about where you want to go and what you want to see, and if you want to be on your own, or be with a larger group. Destinations offered include waterfalls (with optional boat rental), a zoo, a lighthouse(s), shipwreck museum, a microbrewery, wine tasting, shopping, a bear ranch, beaches, scenic overlook(s), a two-mile boardwalk, gambling, or spending quality time with your significant other at the motel. Of course, there will be a tailgate party Friday late afternoon, "Show and Shine" early Saturday AM, a spouse swap Saturday afternoon, and everyone is encourage to wear their FVR-PCA or Porsche logo clothing. If you'd like more details about the trip ahead of time, I can send you a script of the tour for your review.

Sunday's return route will generally be on your own, with several suggestions for points of interest along your return trek. Some of us may travel together to common destinations. 



World Race Update

At precisely 1:18PM, July 21, 2011, Price Racing's 2007 Chevrolet Corvette arrived at the Eiffel Tower in Paris, France after 11,893 driving miles and 22,000+ total miles!

Since my last update at the international half way point in Kazakhstan we crossed into Russia after ten hours for the border crossing and six days later into Europe after just a few hours at the border. Kazhak roads were the worst of the trip and Russia's not much better. Even with 100+ MPH speeds on the German Autobahn we only averaged 32 MPH for the 41 driving days overseas. We found the Kazhaks to be very rude. They would demand to sit in the cars and then would proceed to push every button on the dash. The Russians, however, were extremely polite and would even ask before taking pictures of the cars.

The beer was one of the highlights of my trip. It got better and better as we went west and culminated in Germany. The Russian vodka was as smooth as water but we did not feel like we drank water the next morning.

Car clubs met us in Russia and Europe and sometimes escorted us into and out of their towns. The Russians were very proud of their post war "boxy" cars. We toured many auto museums the best of which was the Deutsches Museum in Munich, Germany where we viewed the Protos auto that finished second in the 1908 race. I highly recommend the "Deutsches" as well as the U.S. Automobile Museum in Reno, Nevada.

Of course one of the highlights was driving the German Autobahn. It is no longer entirely unlimited speed; instead only select 4 - 5 mile stretches are unlimited. We took full advantage of each stretch reaching speeds of 130 MPH. Gasoline was plentiful and of great quality. We packed extra gasoline filters and strainers but did not have to use them. We even found 102 octane benzene to run in the Corvette.

Porsche's strong performance at the riveting eighth round of the American Le Mans Series was rounded off by Joerg Bergmeister (Germany) and Patrick Long (USA): With the Porsche 911 GT3 RSR, the title defenders won the GT class in a photo finish final and secured their first win of the season featuring the world's fastest sports cars. For Porsche, this marked victory number three after Mid-Ohio and Baltimore.

Interest from the fans for the Porsche 911 GT3 R Hybrid was enormous in California, as well. And the way the innovative sports car from Weissach - which started from the rear of the grid and was not eligible for points - chased through the field in just a few laps to snatch the lead caused a sensation in the grandstands. The Porsche 911 GT3 R Hybrid convinced with its consistently fast lap times and low fuel consumption and finished ahead of all other GT vehicles thanks to its ground-breaking drive concept.

"The start phase was huge fun, because it was relatively easy to overtake the slower competitors," said Romain Dumas. "But it's even more fun because we can apply superior tactics thanks to the lower fuel consumption. We are much more flexible and we made the most of this today." Richard Lietz stated: "We had the least pit stops of all the teams and showed clearly what the Porsche 911 GT3 R Hybrid can do. We didn't experience one technical problem and left all the other GT vehicles behind us. Our expectations have been far exceeded."

Thrills and spills also characterised the fight for victory in the fiercely-contested GT class as always. Spectacular tussles for positions on the track and in the pits as well as frequent changes at the lead were played out over the entire race – and in the last two hours, long after darkness had fallen on the Laguna Seca Raceway, events began to heat up: In the penultimate lap, Joerg Bergmeister squeezed past a BMW into second place with his Porsche 911 GT3 RSR fielded by Flying Lizard Motorsports. But the most successful GT pilot in the American Le Mans Series wasn't yet finished. He wanted victory – and in the final lap he pushed fast the leading Ferrari.

"That was our first win this season. We did it at last and it was high time for that," said Joerg Bergmeister. "We didn't have the fastest car in the field today, but we fought to the flag. That paid off. To go from third to first in the last laps - you don't experience this every day in such a strongly-supported series." Patrick Long added: "Joerg won the race today. Our tactic was to keep out of any squabbles as much as possible and to have the car in one piece at the end to fight for victory. This worked, but the driving style of several competitors was clearly too tough today. It almost cost us the race."





In the second Porsche 911 GT3 RSR fielded by Flying Lizard Motorsports, Porsche factory pilot Marco Holzer (Germany) joined forces with American Seth Neiman to bring home ninth place. "The track was new for me and has to be one of the most beautiful in the USA. The race was a fantastic experience," he said. "I'm pleased that we finished well. It was great fun." Sascha Maassen (Germany) and Bryce Miller (USA) saw the flag in tenth with Paul Miller Racing's Porsche 911 GT3 RSR.

After wins from Mid-Ohio and Baltimore, luck evaded Wolf Henzler in Laguna Seca. The Porsche works driver from Germany had taken over the Porsche 911 GT3 RSR from his teammate Bryan Sellers (USA) and was lying within striking distance of the top when a rival hit his rear shortly before the halfway point of the race. The impact damaged the water pump and put a stop to Falken Tire's recent run of successes. "Such a retirement is of course hugely disappointing, especially after our wins of the last weeks," Wolf Henzler said. "Now we have to roll up our sleeves and try to turn the best season for our team so far into a happy ending at Road Atlanta."

The ninth and final round of the American Le Mans Series takes place on 1 October on the Road Atlanta race track at Braselton, in the US State of Georgia.

At the same time as the penultimate race of the American Le Mans Series, Porsche teams were also fighting for championship honours in the equally as popular Grand-Am Series which held its final race on the Mid-Ohio Sports Car

Course in Lexington/Ohio. With the Porsche 911 GT3 Cup run by the successful customer team Brumos Racing, which is based on the lightweight 911 GT3 RS sports car, Americans Leh Keen and Andrew Davis secured the title with fourth place. The highlight of the exciting season was the Daytona 24 hour race in Florida, where Porsche kicked off the season with a double victory for the Porsche 911 GT3 Cup.


