

Schedule for the Waushara county tour on Sunday, August 29:

We will meet at the Aurora hospital parking lot in Oshkosh at 11am. To get there, take highway 41 to Oshkosh and exit onto highway 21. Go West on highway 21 for 0 .3 miles, the hospital is on the left at Westhaven drive.

Tour Route:

- We will leave Aurora at 11:30am and proceed to Omro via highway 21 west.
- After crossing the Fox river in Omro, we will turn right onto highway 116.
- We will then turn left on county D, then right on highway 49. left on county H, right on 26th street, right on county W, left on county A into Wild Rose where we will stop for lunch at the Pioneer Pub. http://www.thepioneerpub.com The trip to Wild Rose takes about one hour. 

Two Seater, Open Air Cayenne?

If you think this golf cart bears a strong resemblance to the Porsche Cayenne, you're right. Hans-Peter Porsche, the grandson of the company's founder, commissioned the prototype and the Porsche Engineering Group came through, creating two vehicles for use at Spain's Alcanada Golf Course.

That's the Porsche logo on the golf cart's front lid, and the Cayenne design is evident in other areas, including the vehicle's engine compartment lid, front wheel arches, headlights, front fascia, and 20-inch wheels.

The Mini-Cayenne is powered by a 3.2-bhp electric motor. It can cruise at 19 mph.

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August Social on Lake Winnebago

Justin Pauly happily accepts the FVR's Certificate of Appreciation for hosting a delicious home-cooked dinner and social at his family's cottage on Lake Winnebago.

Opting to ride up to Mountain for the MotorHed party on two wheels, I made an obligatory stop at a small cheese factory for provisions along the way. In this case it was Belle Plaine Cheese Factory, found between Cloverleaf Lakes and Shawano just a bit off Highway 22. They produce an exceptional aged cheddar, and a smoked baby swiss that makes for some awesome sub sandwiches. Once the necessary supplies were stashed away, the journey continued. While thoroughly enjoying a spirited ride up though Menominee County on Wisconsin 55 I realized my clutch was failing to maintain full engagement at the output end, well, uh- let's say in the higher ranges of the power band in the big gears, so it looks like there is another project is on the to-do list.

Once navigating to the MotorHed party, I had the pleasure of meeting with a few of the motorcyclist that made the trip for a day of riding and partying afterwards. After Pete had held the driver's/rider's briefing it was clutches out, with the Porsche contingent in the lead. Following the P-cars by a good margin, it soon became apparent that a navigational dilemma was imminent - my arms were simply not long enough to hold the map far enough away to read the directions. My old Garmin GPS that would normally be mounted on the BMW had given up the ghost this spring and in my haste to hit the road that morning the Wisconsin Delomre Gazetteer failed to find its way into my hardcase. Big oops!

With those minor distractions my plans were altered slightly, the day would evolve into what the National Forest roads are well suited for; pointing the bike in a given direction and following where the Forest service roads take me. After starting out on the provided route heading west

and north of Mountain, and waving at Dennis and Madelyn (going the other way, with a motorcycle following them), it seemed that apparently I was already succeeding at getting lost, although that wasn't the last time that day a Speed Yellow Cayman was seen heading the opposite direction. Having found my way back to highway 32 and heading north for a short distance before the traffic was making the ride less comfortable, Forest Service Road 2123 heading west beckoned.

Taking to the unpaved forest service roads such as this are a major differentiation in the preference for routing when riding the bike as compared to the making the trip in the Boxster. After following the winding gravel through the depths of the Nicolet National Forest for about 12 miles

my tires were once again on pavement, signaling it was time for stopping on the shoulder to review the route map with the intent of finding my way to the lunch stop. At the very moment of determining that I was now on Sawyer Lake Road, and back on the route mapped out for us, a familiar sounding exhaust note rumbled by as a Cayenne and GT3 rolled past. Following Andrew and Nick, with their impeccable timing, provided easy navigation to the Northwoods Cafe where the group reassembled for a well deserved break.

Taking to the back roads on this journey, was awe inspiring to recognize the forces of nature, with the very visible effects of the June 7, 2007 tornado still evident from County Road T, Highway 32, and again east of 32 on Forest Service Road 2106 east of highway 32. That F3 force tornado with winds estimated at 140 to 160 MPH cut a nearly straight line swath of destruction at least 1/2 mile wide for over 40 miles, from Matoon in eastern Shawano County to the northeast near the Oconto-Marinette County line. Viewing Google maps satellite imagery, the path of that storm is clearly visible on the more recently updated high resolution photography (sorry to digress, but an interest in meteorology, much like an interest in journalism, was something inherited from my father).

After going back and forth on County Road T, that couple decided we didn't know where we were going and started to follow a group of motorcycles that passed us while we were looking at our maps.

The second time, Madelyn, the navigator, who gets easily confused with map directions, thought they missed the Lunch Stop because we went through the intersection of Highway 55 and 52 and The Town of Lily and there wasn't any NorthWoods Inn or Shell Station there, so she had Dennis turn around, and of course the group of motorcycles that were then behind them turned around also, because they thought we knew what we were doing. That was the most embarrassing moment, because the lead motorcycle did the circling the wagons-reverse direction motion, upon which the entire group turned around and formed at a corner parking lot to wonder what the H__ was going on! After another embarrassing discussion and further looking at the map and sheets of instructions we saw that the Northwoods Inn was still up the road and we hadn't gotten there yet.

The third time we headed out of the Northwoods Inn after lunch following a group of motorcycles when they decided to pull over for some sort of discussion and we continued on. We then missed County Highway Q, turned right to follow some of the motorcycles, and another of the Porsches, but alas had to reverse course once again. When we reversed course, it was a lonely drive from then on, as we did not see another Porsche or motorcycle for the rest of the route! The moral of the story is "THAT" Yellow Car needs a GPS system or a "navigator".

Making the right turn on to County Road DD, and memorizing the next few turns-travelling all the way to Highway 32 on County Road Q without finding County Road W, I saw yet another Speed Yellow Cayman traveling the opposite direction. Well, so much for my following instructions, it was time to navigate the back roads with dead reckoning unaccompanied by maps, compass, or GPS. That process quickly guided me onto Forest Service Road 2106 south of Townsend, which eventually led me back to Mountain. Once back at

Bollenbach's for the MotorHed Party, it was time for me to decide to either pitch the tent and stay the night or plan on making the trip back home later in the afternoon.

Enjoying Pete and Kathie's incredibly generous hospitality, and looking over the vast array of machinery, I was pie-eyed with the accounts of one particular motorcycle, that being John Young's 1963 Norton Manx. Hearing the story of how John acquired this bike was as incredible as the history of the bike itself, with this particular example having been piloted to third place in the infamous 1967 Isle of



We purchased the car in the summer of 1978 from Import Motors in Two Rivers, WI. I drove it home, approximately ten miles, and started taking it apart. I had to remove the interior, glass, wiring, insulation, front suspension, engine and trans-axel. I then took the body shell, along with the doors, trunk and hood to Franklin, WI to have it dipped in acid. After twenty-four hours in the acid tank the body was cleaned and sprayed with zinc chromate. At this point I found out that the car was a poor choice for restoration. Many sheet metal parts like the floors, front nose, longitudinals and inner fender panels had to be purchased.



I then took the body shell to Appleton, WI to have the major welding done. A parts car was purchased to get a tunnel, wiring harnesses and a few miscellaneous other parts. While the body work was being done I used the wire harnesses from both cars to replace bad wiring with the proper gauge and colors. The car has seven harnesses.



Also at this time I purchased a complete rubber kit, carpet kit and trim items. At least the prices were more reasonable than they are now.



The engine was taken to Import Motors where Dick Shinnick did a short block rebuild. After it was returned home, I finished assembling it. The transmission and suspension parts were cleaned and inspected and set aside. When the body work was finished the body went to Paul Kaufmann for painting. When the painting was completed the body shell was returned to my shop. At this point we had the chance to purchase a 1954 XK120 Open Two Seat Jaguar. I started working on the Jaguar only to find out that it also was a poor candidate for restoration but I finished it three years later.

A friend gave me approximately twenty flat hides of black leather which I used on the XK120 and also on the 356. An older gentleman from Two Rivers sewed the leather for me and I installed it all.

Between working full time and keeping numerous other cars running, the 356 was only worked on occasionally. Upon retirement I was able to devote more time to completing the 356. Barb was always my third hand when something had to be held as well as being exactly the person I needed to help me install the carpeting. Barb was also very skillful in writing checks for parts required to complete the restoration. Thirty-two years later on Friday, July 16, 2010 we took the car for the first test drive and the next day we drove it to Elkhart Lake and entered the Road & Track Concours D'Elegance. We were fortunate in that we placed first in our class and as a result showed the car on Sunday in the "Best Of The Best" Competition. We did not trophy on Sunday but the many compliments made this thirty-two year endeavor very worthwhile. We are very proud of the car and we hope you will come to see it on September 26th.

Porsche 60th Anniversary



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Porsche Marks its 60th Anniversary Year With a Road Trip Past Major Milestones

ATLANTA—August 13, 2010—Over the past 60 years, the Porsche family tree has spread strong and deep roots in American soil. During this time, the company's product portfolio has also grown, from just one model—the legendary 356—to 30 current variants, including the new Panamera four-door sports sedan. In addition to product milestones, countless other markers have signaled PCNA's U.S. achievements, from early victories on the country's most famous race tracks to major sales successes and awards.

Today, as Porsche celebrates its 60th anniversary in America, let's revisit some of the highlights that have distinguished Porsche's journey. Here are just a few annotated events from Porsche's American history book, beginning with one man's passion for a singular German sports car.

- 1950: Austrian turned New Yorker Max Hoffman, who already established a successful European import business with his Hoffman Motor Cars, introduces the first-ever Porsche 356 to America. Hoffman knows that American servicemen who served overseas in WWII developed a passion for European sports cars. While Ferdinand "Ferry" Porsche hopes Hoffman might sell five Porsches a year, Hoffman explains: "If I cannot sell 5 per week, then I'm not interested in the business."
- 1950: The first three Porsches arrive on American soil. Two are delivered to a gentleman racer
 who would become the patron of American sports car racing, Briggs Cunningham. The third
 remains with its importer, Max Hoffman—who goes on to win the "Most Interesting Car" award
 at the 1950 Watkins Glen Concours d'Elegance in September.
- 1951: Fellow Austrian Expatriate Johnny von Neumann, owner of Competition Motors in Los Angeles, introduces Porsche to Southern California after a visit to Hoffman in New York City. Von Neumann counts many celebrities as clients, including James Dean, and helps turn California into the single largest market for Porsche.
- 1952: The birth of today's Porsche logo occurs when Dr. Ferry Porsche visits Hoffman in New York City. Porsche sketches the crest for the state of Baden-Württemberg with the black prancing horse from Stuttgart's coat of arms. He adds the word Porsche across the top.
- 1953: An exhibit at the Museum of Modern Art opens featuring 10 automobiles, including a 1952 Porsche 1500 Super.
- 1954: The first Porsche appears at the New York Auto Show, marking Porsche's entry into the mainstream American car culture. Max Hoffman is now selling 11 Porsches per week, totaling 30 percent of all of Porsche's global sales.

- 1955: The Porsche Club of America (PCA) is established after only five years of Porsche in America.
- 1956: The first Porsche Parade is held at the Washingtonian Hotel in Maryland just outside the nation's capital. Sixty-four PCA members attend.
- 1958: The first vertical-drive inline German engine was displayed at the New York Auto Show.
- 1959: Porsche of America Corporation (PoAC) was established in Teaneck, NJ after it became
 evident that a single corporate entity was needed to import, service and market the German
 marque. Nearly 50 percent of all Porsches manufactured were being imported to America by
 this time.
- 1960: Porsche claims overall victory at The 12 Hours of Sebring with its 718 RS 60 racecar. This marks one of the first substantial American victories for Porsche.
- 1963: The venerable Porsche 911 is introduced marking a new era of performance sports cars in America.
- 1968: Porsche achieves first overall victory at the 24 Hours of Daytona with the Type 907-8.
- 1969: More than 100 new Porsche dealerships open simultaneously in the U.S. as part of a planned marketing campaign heralding the popularity of the brand.
- 1969: Porsche partners with Volkswagen to build the 914. 250,000 units were sold in the U.S. over its production run.
- 1971: The first-ever Porsche driving school, a precursor to the current Porsche Sport Driving School, is held in Long Island.
- 1974: The remarkable Porsche 911 Turbo is introduced making an already-capable performer even more accomplished. The 911 Turbo has remained Porsche's halo car ever since.
- 1979: Actor Paul Newman wins second place at LeMans in a Porsche 935 Turbo. Newman's fascination with Porsche and racing garners new enthusiasts and further establishes Porsche as a serious sports car.
- 1983: Porsche places 1-2-3 at Daytona filling the winners podium for the first time in America.
- 1983: The Porsche 928S is the fastest car sold in North America.
- 1984: Porsche Cars North America is established and remains the sole importer of Porsche vehicles for the United States.
- 1996: The Porsche Boxster is introduced with U.S. demand exceeding all expectations.
- 1998: Porsche introduces water-cooled engines in the 911 after 35 years.
- 1998: Porsche Cars North America moves its office from Reno, NV to Atlanta, GA.
- 2000: Porsche wins the GT Class in the American LeMans Series.
- **2002:** Porsche puts the "sport" into sport utility and launches the first-ever Porsche SUV, the Cayenne. The Cayenne becomes the best-selling Porsche in America.

- 2004: Porsche introduces the Carrera GT super car with a mid-engine 5.7L V10.
- 2006: The Porsche RS Spyder LPM2 claims class championship in the American LeMans Series.
- 2009: The four-door Porsche Panamera is introduced with resounding success and tops the Cayenne as best-selling Porsche in America.
- 2010: The largest Porsche dealership in North America, Jack Daniels Motors in Upper Saddle River, NJ, opens it doors, featuring 25,000 square feet of space and a showroom that can present 30 models.
- 2010: Nearly 2000 Porsche Club of America members attend the PCA's 55th Annual Porsche Parade in St. Charles, IL.

Green Light for the 918 Spyder



Green Light for Series Development of the 918 Spyder

In its session today, the Supervisory Board of Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche AG, Stuttgart, gave the green light for series development of the Porsche 918 Spyder. Reflecting the overwhelming response from the public and customers to the Concept Study, the Supervisory Board gave Porsche's Board of Management the mission to develop a production model based on the car already presented. This concept version of an ultra-high-performance mid-engined sports car with plug-in hybrid technology made its debut at the 2010 Geneva Motor Show and at Auto China in Bejing, hitting the headlines worldwide.

Michael Macht, President and Chairman of the Board of Management of Porsche AG: "Production of the 918 Spyder in a limited series proves that we are taking the right approach with Porsche Intelligent Performance featuring the combination of supreme performance and efficient drivetrain concepts. We will develop the 918 Spyder in Weissach and assemble it in Zuffenhausen. This is also a very important commitment to Germany as a manufacturing base."

The Concept Study of the 918 Spyder allows CO2 emissions of just 70 g/km, corresponding to fuel consumption of 3.0 litre/100 km (94.1 mpg imp) in the NEDC, on the one hand, and the performance of a super-sports car, on the other. This extremely efficient drivetrain technology then forms a symbiosis in the 918 Spyder with truly outstanding design and high-tech motorsport achievements. Further product details of the 918 Spyder will be disclosed in the months to come.
