






## September 19, 2015: Alfa Heaven Tour

First Time 1987 Carrera Engine Drop - Chapter 14 - "The Home Stretch" Jim Prellwitz, Technical Chairperson

Well I know that last time I said I would be starting on the injection system but I was a bit sidetracked with a few other things first. The wiring for the speed sensors and the Head temperature sensor wiring all basically crumbled in my hands when reattaching the back sheet metal so I began that replacement job. The head temperature sensor was a pretty easy replacement. The sensor screws into the number 3 cylinder and comes out the hole in the back sheet metal through the grommet that plugs the hole. Then it runs back into the engine compartment through another grommet (the speed sensor cables run through the second grommet as well). A little silicone spray helped the grommets fit into position in the sheet metal without too much struggling.





While I am waiting for the new sensors to arrive I worked on some of the widgets and bobs that need to be installed under the injection system before it is set on top of the engine. I bolted on the throttle linkage plate and installed the new gaskets in the much cleaner breather cap and oil temperature sensor.

Once I had the harness lay out the way I remembered it, I got the gaskets ready for the intake system. There is a top and bottom gasket along with a spacer that goes on each of the intakes before mounting the intake components to the top of the engine. I am

not sure if this will improve anything but the old gaskets and spacers and gaskets fell apart when I removed the intake early in the process.







Once I had all of the gaskets and spacers in place, I was ready to set the intake and injection system on to the engine.

I carefully set the whole system on to the studs. It was a bit tricky as the tolerance is pretty close and you have to set down each of the six intakes at the same time. Once the intake was squarely situated on the engine I bolted the whole thing down with new barrel nuts.



The next tricky part was reconnecting the throttle springs. There are two of them, and each has one end attached to the throttle control lever and the other end to a small lug on the intake itself.





A hand tool to have is a very long needle nose plier. I connected one end of each spring by hand and then used the pliers to pull the spring far under the intake to hook to the mounting lugs. You cannot get your hands in this area so the tool really helps.

One common age failure with the 3.2 liter Carrera engine is a small vacuum tube at the back of the engine. It is referred to as the "pipe" in much of the literature I have reviewed. It is a small (about 8" long) copper tube with a crimped on adapter hose. It goes from the vacuum system to a port on the rubber intake elbow. Age tends to make the rubber brittle and prone to cracking.





Of course at the time I was working on the engine, I learned that this component is no longer produced by Porsche so I did a lot of investigating as to how to repair it. The simplest and most common repair is to just wrap it in self-sealing electrical tape. Unfortunately that is only a short term fix as further investigation shows that the heat from the engine, after a short time, melts the tape and it starts leaking again.









Fortunately I was able to split the crimped metal and remove the rubber part while saving the copper tube. Then I found a domestic vacuum tube that was fairly close to the reduction needed and I used small hose clamps to tighten it back together. It's not a perfect replacement but it works. Of course as luck would have it, I found out that because of the demand for replacements, an aftermarket supplier has started making this part again. Of course it costs about \$140, so my \$7 fix looks pretty good in the books.

While I was working on the vacuum hose, my sensor wires arrived so I was able to reinstall them as well. The trick



with the sensors is to find a washer that is .08mm thick to use as a spacer to set the distance from the flywheel teeth. Too close and you wreck the sensors when you turn the engine over. Too far away and they don't sense the flywheel position and the engine management system doesn't know what is going on.V The new wiring and some new hardware makes the back sheet metal look a lot better and more organized. The wires from the sensors and the head temperature sensor run through the sheet metal grommet into the engine compartment and up to the bracket mounted on the intake manifold.







I also began laying out my new spark plug wires from Clewett Engineering. I was not sure about replacing the original wires but they are 27 years old and I figured as long as I had the old ones off, this might be a good time to see if there is any improvement with a better wire. I went with the Clewett based on feedback from reviewers and also the price was not bad compared to the original Porsche Beru set. I kept the old set with all of the hardware in case I get nostalgic for the old style.





After about 6 months on and off of working on the engine, I finally have it off the stand and on my floor cart. Next I will be working on the transmission and putting it back into the car.



# **FVR ID Badge Update**


### New Fox Valley Region ID Badges are available!

### The Learning Curve
