Bryan is completely confident in the Eagle™ design, but still does a safety walk down after every lift. He inspects each of the multiple points of the built in automatic safety latches before adventuring underneath. A novel factory supplied caster accessory actually allows you to lift and roll the entire lift assembly around the garage!

He took the time to explain to the group how he had to modify his suburban $2\frac{1}{2}$ stall garage's rafters to allow some much needed headroom for the roof of the car, and the customizing of his existing garage door opener track & mounting hardware. His engineering expertise was quite evident in all of these thoughtful modifications.

First Time 1987 Carrera Engine Drop - Chapter 13 - "The Corner Turned" Jim Prellwitz, Technical Chairperson


With the heads firmly tightened down but not completely torqued, since I want to have just a bit of play while aligning the cam carriers, I began the reassembly of the cams. Making sure the mating surfaces of the heads and the cam carriers are clean is a critical step as there are no gaskets at this area.



The cam carriers fit nicely over the studs with nary a wiggle required. I gently tapped them into place and began installing the 18 hex nuts and barrel nuts on each side.

When you have a nut on each stud, you will ask yourself why there are leftover hex nuts. Well, I'll tell you why. It's because there are only studs for three barrel nuts on each side. If you look carefully, you will see that there are three barrel nuts where there should be hex nuts.

The valve cover won't fit if these barrel nuts are left this way. They extend past the machined surface. This is why I don't like to torque things down until I am sure they are in the correct position. Thankfully I took many pictures so I could figure out the error of my ways very quickly and put all of the nuts in their correct positions. Once again all was well.



Once everything was in its proper location and tightened down, I could slide the camshafts into their respective carriers. The right and left cams are quite different so I spent a lot of time verifying that their orientation was correct before I started buttoning things up. A liberal amount of assembly lube on the bearing surfaces and lobes made sure that things should start smoothly once I was ready to turn the engine over.

Once I had the cams in and the cam shims, gears, chains, washers and bolts installed, I began to install the rockers for the number 1 and number 4 cylinders. You need to install these first and set the lifter gap in order to be ready to set the timing. But that is later.



I planned for replacing a few items and upgrading an item on the rockers since I had them apart. An inspection revealed that the surfaces of the lifter pads were in good shape so replacing the rockers was not needed. I did, however, decide to replace the rusty rocker bolts and hardware. They were not in terrible condition but they were a bit rusty.

The old bolt is on the left and the new replacement is on the right. The bolt head and nut is wedged so that when they are tightened, they ever so slightly expand the rocker shaft and form a seal against the shaft bearing surface of the cam carrier. So changing the bolts and nuts was just simple precaution.

The other thing that I decided to do was to perform a little upgrade. Standard Carrera rocker shafts come with grooves cut into them. The rocker shafts are the same shafts that are used in the RS versions of the 911. The grooves in the RS version have a small O-ring installed in them for additional sealing against oil egress. So it was a simple matter of procuring the O-rings and installing them on the existing rocker shafts.







With the first bank of rockers installed and gap adjusted, I began the black magic process of setting the timing. I had read a lot about the timing of the flat-six engine and while I thought I understood the workings of this version of the internal combustion engine, the setting of timing is still a bit funky to me.

Step one is to set engine at top dead center for cylinder 1. OK. I know what TDC is. The manual says to verify TDC with the marks on the crank pulley and the position of the rotor on the distributor. Well wouldn't you know that there are 4 marks on the crank pulley? My pulley has a TDC mark along with 2 other marks at 120 degrees apart and another mark about 10 degrees past the TDC mark. It's a bit confusing.



I found the easiest way to double check the TDC. Since a did not have the plugs in, I just took a 1/8" X 12" long plastic stick (for lack of a better term) and stuck it in the plug hole so it touched the piston top. Then I just put a wrench on the crank and turned over the engine until the stick rose to the top and began going back down. I noted the position of the pulley and the rotor and with these three things I was able to determine which of the marks on the pulley was the true mark for TDC. Yeah I didn't need to do it this way but it was more interesting.



Setting the timing is a matter of setting number 1 to TDC and then setting up the dial gauge. Give it about 10mm of compression so it can move up and down without bottoming out and set the actuator point on the edge of the valve. I picked up one of the little z-clamps to make it easier to hold in position.

Once it is set up, slowly turn the crank clockwise until the gauge reads the correct overlap for the engine. For the Carrera 3.2, it is 1.25mm. Then stop. This is where the black magic starts. The pulley mark should be at TDC for number 4 cylinder. If not, remove the bolt and cover washer. Then remove the alignment pin and continue to rotate the crank without turning the cam until the

TDC mark is in the correct location. Then reinsert the alignment pin. It will only fit in one of the holes as the gear and alignment holes are slightly offset to allow for a wide variety of adjustment. Then put it all back together and start all over again.

I watched a video on Youtube where an "expert" named Nick Fuljames in England was setting the timing on a 2.7 engine and had to repeat this 4 times to get it right. He said that it almost always take more than twice. I am still not sure how it works. And then you have to do the same for the number 4 cylinder. One more problem is that if you do not keep strong tension on the timing chain while you are setting the timing, you can have the timing off by several degrees and your car will sound like a single cylinder John Deere tractor. Yes, I know this to be true.

Notice that I am keeping good pressure on the timing chain on the opposite cylinder bank.



Firm in my belief that I have successfully set the timing correctly, I began to button everything up.



When I was disassembling the top of the engine I had rotated the engine over and a piece of metal fell out, along with a couple of screws, a nut, the missing end of my cruise control cable and a screw driver bit. It's amazing what an engine will gather up after 140,000 miles.



Well I soon discovered what the metal bit was. It seems that at some point one of the air vanes on the generator shroud had become destabilized and decided to separate from itself. It almost seems as if something was jammed through the fan and pried against the air vanes. You can see in the photo where the piece had been broken off. It is time for further disassembly.

Here is the shroud and metal bit that fell out of the engine. It seems to have been something fairly

solid that did the damage as the rivet securing the vane was also broken.

Well this simply won't do. I removed the rivet and re attached with a new larger aluminum pop rivet. Then with my handy dandy brazing torch, I reattached the broken vane.



And finally with a dab of paint, the shroud is as good as new. Since I had some paint left over, I got a little crazy with the engine cover also.









It looks nice I think with the nice clean parts and nice black engine tin.

Well, I think that is enough for today. Next I will start the work on the injection system. Wish me luck!

FVR ID Badge Update


New Fox Valley Region ID Badges are available!
