FVR 25th Anniversary Ralleye Info

Advance 25th Anniversary ralleye information for participants and navigators

Odometer Correction

Due to the fact that ALL odometers are not the same, at the start of the Rallye we will have an exact start check sign.

At a point near the start (Yet to be determined) but 5 - 10 miles out on the route, we will have a mileage check sign with the exact mileage that the Rallye Master had at this point. Because the Official Rallye Miles (ORM) is an important part of the scoring, this check will allow you to correct your odometer error.

Examples

At the mileage check your odometer is over the check sign,

CHECK SIGN Divided By

MILES OVER = CORRECTION FACTOR

Example using 5 mile check sign:

5 mile check sign divided by 5.2 (your odometer) = .9615 CORRECTION FACTOR

At the mileage check your odometer is under the check sign,

CHECK SIGN Divided By

MILES UNDER = CORRECTION FACTOR

Example using 5 mile check sign:

4.8 (your odometer) divided by 5 mile check sign = 1.0416

Your mileage at the finish (less off course miles) times the CORRECTION FACTOR = ORM


Picnic at Road America Turn 5 (old 356 Park)

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

Tribute to Hiltrud

Bob Geiser has shared these words with us after the recent passing of Hiltrud, his wife of 46 years.

Since she comes from outside the USA and lived her most of her life, she faced unique situations not normally addressed by native Americans. In the fall of 1967 (we met in June earlier) I approached her on eventually coming to America to live, since I was to eventually return after my enlistment in the Air Force would be ended in March 1968. I needed a yes or no fairly soon. She thought it over for some

time and in January 1968 we became engaged, and eventually married, in August of that year. Imagine this: coming to a strange foreign country as an adult, already established in a career, starting over again and learning a foreign language she didn't particularly care for, at least, initially. But she succeeded in spite of me.

She was an independent operator, before and after marriage. After training as a preschool kindergarten teacher, she worked in several different locations in the Black Forest area, in Rheinhessen just south of Bonn, and eventually in Rheinland-Pfalz, not far from Ramstein Air Base where I was stationed. When we met, she came "nicely-equipped", having both newly-acquired driver's license and a car. Not many women at that time or in that area in that age-range were thus privileged. When she came here, she discovered Milwaukee and Chicago and could soon navigate them, at least go to the respective airports and German import stores unescorted and return in one piece.

Health issues caught up with her. Heart problems were the major issue. Even after two bypass surgeries matters still were not right. Valve problems arose and eventually resolved, but the heart muscle never recovered to the point of survivability. It was her choice to die at home and we family members accommodated her wish.

At the funeral and burial the theme was Joy. Hers was a life well-lived, along with 3 adopted children (Our family comes from 3 continents!) and 5 grandchildren.

First Time 1987 Carrera Engine Drop - Chapter 12 - "The Corner Turned"

With the parts finally back from the machine shop I am ready to start putting this beast back together. The cam carriers look much better after being cleaned. I'll do some wire brush cleanup of the stud

threads and a thread chaser to make sure there are no threading problems or galling when I reattach the valve covers. The timing chain

cases have mounting points on the back side that hold the studs for the chain guide rails and they are prone to leaking. The factory uses a product similar to JB weld to seal them up so after an appropriate amount of cleaning and inspection, I did the same. Applying liberal amount of JB



weld to the back of the cases where the studs are mounted should give the cases new life.




With the old head studs removed from the crank case I am ready to do some more cleaning and then install the new steel studs. Common practice in Porsche engine rebuilding circles is to definitely replace the lower Dilivar head studs due to their tendency for becoming brittle and breaking after many cycles of heating and cooling. The old upper studs looked pretty good but were showing just a little rust so I thought that it would be best to just replace all of them. You can tell the difference between the two or if yours have been changed out by applying a magnet. Steel studs are magnetic and the Dilivar studs are not so much.

After some cleaning I gathered up my parts, a head stud nut, a couple of bottles of Loctite red No. 271 and a trusty measuring device. The head studs need to be extended exaclty 135mm from the base of the block in order to fit the cylinders, heads and cam carriers.



First I chased all the threads with a tap to make sure there were no thread issues. Then I began installing the new steel studs, applying the Loctite and then screwing into the hole to the correct depth. They turned in very easily and it was very relieving when they were finally all installed and the Loctite was setting up.

The Heads, cylinders and studs were all cleaned and measured for tolerance by the machine shop and all were within specifications so all it took was some cleaning and replacement of the valve guides and valve stem seals. The shop removed the old piston rings as well in order to check the ring groove tolerances. Again, I was relieved to find out that everything was holding up very well. Some cleaning and a light hone of the cylinder walls was all that was recommended. The parts came back to me ready to reassemble.









After a little inspection I took them to my bench in the basement for the assembly work. Laying them out with the boxes of new rings and my measuring tools (to confirm the tolerances and ring gap) I was



ready to begin. Assembly actually went pretty easy. A handy ring compression tool made the job very smooth. I had decided to preassemble the cylinders with the pistons and connecting pins on my work bench to make it easier to put the whole thing back together once I was back in the garage.

After a good number of hours ensuring I had the rings in the correct sequence and that the pistons were aligned correctly in the cylinders

things actually looked pretty good. I was ready to return to the garage.

Doing it this way, you have to remember to keep all of the pins needing circlips installed pointed in the same direction. Otherwise you can't get at the end one and have to take the first ones off again. Yes, I found out the hard way. Once you remember this trick, the cylinders actually go on quite easily. Just remember that there is a base gasket that has to be on before you connect the piston to the rod and slide the cylinder into the case. Trust me, it won't fit over the assembly once the piston is connected to the rod. I know this to be true.

To hold the cylinders on, I used the old school method of head stud nut and a ½" long socket. There are some very unique and specialized (read expensive) tools to accomplish this but I did not

feel like spending the money for a set of the holding nuts produced by Porsche or some of the aftermarket tool suppliers.

I also took this opportunity to install the new one piece oil return tubes in the case. These are the original type and can also be replaced with the two piece extending tubes without removing the heads. Since I had the heads off, I went this route. I also took some time to paint up and reinstall the air flow tins since I had it apart. These also went on easily. Then, one at a time, I set the heads in place.











The heads fit nicely and a light tap with my handy plastic hammer ensured they were set in place. Then, with a little creative use of a long screw driver, I dropped the heavy head stud washers in place and then the head stud barrel nuts. A little tightening to hold it all in place until after the cam carriers are installed and then it can all be tightened to the specified torque.











Once the heads were on and tightened with my 10mm long socket hex-wrench, courtesy of McMaster, I covered the intakes and exhaust ports to make sure there would be no unwanted parts falling into the heads after I spent so much on getting them back to clean state.





Next I will start to work on the cam carriers, cams and rocker installation.

Sergio & Kathy Heredia hosted their first-ever event on April 18th, a tour to Bailey's Harbor followed by dinner at the Coyote Roadhouse. FVR ID Badge Update


New Fox Valley Region ID Badges are available!
