

Porsches on the Mac, Aug. 17-19

Hello Porsche Club of America members,

Motor-Stadt Region would like to invite everyone that owns a Porsche to the very first "Beauty & The Bridge - Porsche On The Mac event." This event will take place the weekend of Aug. 17-19, 2018. The major feature of this gala event will be a police escorted caravan from St. Ignace on the north end of the 5-mile bridge across the Straits of Mackinac between Lake Huron and Lake Michigan to Mackinaw City and perhaps back. Members from all PCA regions are invited.

The communities on each end of the bridge have become a hub of summertime car shows, bridge drives, and related gearhead activities. Many car clubs and motorized vehicle groups have successfully staged bridge-drive events based in either of the two towns- Jeeps, Mustangs, Corvettes, Mini Coopers, ATV /ORVs, tractors, trucks, even hearses. Just as a point of reference, the 2017 Corvette event registered 239 cars, with 191 cars crossing the bridge. Last summer's Mini-Cooper gathering attracted more than 1,300 cars. Porsches certainly could and should be able to be equivalently represented.

In addition to the bridge drive, the weekend will feature a car show on Saturday afternoon followed by evening entertainment and cocktail party on the St. Ignace marina dock, culminating with fireworks over the harbor. By extending your visit to Sunday (highly recommended) you can choose a driving tour through Michigan's scenic eastern Upper Peninsula or northern Lower Peninsula or maybe a gimmick rally or scavenger hunt (planning is still going on). The day can be topped off with movies by the bay at American Legion Park.

St. Ignace is one of the most beautiful communities on the Great Lakes, with many choices for lodging and dinning. Other local attractions include the Kewadin Casino, Mackinac Island, Historic Mill Creek, and Fort Michilimackinac. The country and water in the vicinity of the bridge is spectacular and offers many attractions. Hope to see everyone on the bridge.

Kickin' the tires can get you (or your wallet) in trouble

On a Saturday morn in spring of '96, my wife Mary and I decided to take an unscheduled trip to Milwaukee to look at used 911s. We were just kickin' used Porsche tires (I wasn't even against looking at a "fixer upper") and we had

absolutely NO intention of actually buying a car.

But there it was...a freshly traded mint 1989 3.2L 911 Targa in Guards Red in excellent shape on the very first Porsche dealer lot we visited. It had only been there a few hours. Damn. A quick call to the previous owner confirmed a clean history. Then, as it turned out,

the dealer, Concours (now Umansky), also banked with the same folks we did, so they let us take the car "on gratis" that same day back to Jim Page Auto in Green Bay for the all-important pre-purchase inspection. And, we had just \$50 cash in our pocket that day.

Later in 1996, when we called PCA National to join up, they assigned us to Milwaukee Region, NOT Fox Valley Region. This is despite living in Green Bay all our lives. Remember too that Porsche Parade of 1984 had just been headquartered in Appleton by the Chicago Region. I guess geography was not National's strong point at that time. Boy, are we glad we got that straightened out or the story would likely be very different.

Flash forward a few years in fall of 2011, I responded to a local GB Craigslist ad for an all original 2004 4.5L Cayenne S V-8 with only 60k original miles...and it came with both

summer and winter tires and rims. I had seen this vehicle advertised on and off for a long time, so I knew the price was going to be right. After Gordon (and my wife) looked it over, and the Carfax report was reviewed, I bought it as my



daily driver from a local car collector's wife. This SUV has been a real learning curve for me, as it was early in the Porsche SUV's development. Those of you who have seen the "coolant pipe" surgery at Gordon's, or know about the existence of the 2nd battery in the car know what I mean. Boy, am I glad I allowed for these types of things in my bargain purchase price.

So how did a bookkeeper and a utility electronics technician geek end up in the world of Porsche? Well, it dates back to Road America in the early '80s. Coming from humble financial backgrounds, Mary and I begged and borrowed Road America Vintage and Can Am race tickets from friends, vendors, corporate sponsors, and even resorted to volunteering to work

with SCCA and Road America to get free admission to the track. This was in the heyday of Porsche racing victories. Mary asked, "What was the super fast, cute car on the racetrack with the 'bug eyes' and the whaletail?" I guess from that day forward we were hooked on Porsche. The rest is history.

As for personal stuff, Mary and I are aging music and hi-fi fanatics, 'ol fashioned do-it-yourselfers, and woodworkers. Here's a shameless plug for our other long-time affiliation with another local hobby group: Northeastern Wi Woodworkers Guild (www.NEWWG.ORG).

Mary has been your club's secretary for about 18 years, and I established FVR PCA's" free lending library" in about that same timeframe. As for my "brush with Porsche fame," there are just two: Bruce Anderson pub-

Though the temperatures were chilly, 24 members braved the cold and made their way to the Graystone Ale House in De Pere, for the New Member Night on Feb. 6.





The Common View: 911 4S

A few weeks ago in January, I ventured to Bergstrom to test drive a new 911 4S. It was a crisp, sunny day with temperatures mercifully reaching 11 degrees Fahrenheit. The air felt heavy with humidity and the sundrenched exhaust emanating from the waiting 911 shrouded the car in a thin layer of smoke that dissipated as it rose. I had never driven a 911 4S before, so the magical appearance of a glistening Carrera White Metallic 911 veiled in smoke added to the anticipation.

The sports car tested is a testament to elegant refinement, coupled with what seemed to be inexhaustible power. The car had Luxor Beige and black leather interior, with the Porsche crest emblazoned on the headrests.

The 911 was well optioned:

- 3.0-liter twin turbo-charged boxer 6 engine
- 420 hp / 368 lb. ft of torque
- Direct fuel injection
- Sport exhaust
- 20-inch Turbo wheels
- 7 Speed PDK with paddle shift
- Power sport seats
- Bi-Xenon headlights with the Porsche Dynamic lighting system
- 21 MPG City / 28 MPG Hwy
- Lane change assist
- Navigation package
- Reverse camera

As tested, the MSRP was \$142,800, with final assembly completed in Stuttgart, Germany. At first blush the MSRP quickens the pulse. But experiencing the 911 4S puts the price into perspective. As the age of the internal combustion engine approaches midnight, Porsche continues to demonstrate how beautifully power and refinement can combine to create an experience that can be had as often as Wisconsin weather and temperatures cooperate. And as Porschephiles, we all know that life is too short to drive an ordinary car on the weekend.

From the outside, I noticed the unmistakable single band of lighting which traverses the back of a 4S, just below the retractable spoiler. (I understand the light band is also found on the new Panamera 4's as well.) Climbing into the 4S, one notices the carefully detailed white stitching in the leather. Clean lines abound, with Alcantara accents. The flat(ish) dash is reminiscent of the retro 911s of the air-cooled variety. The retro-vibe adds a layer to the ambience and driving experience.

Gripping the steering wheel leads to the sensation of the wheel molding to your hands via the comfortable leather. This provides added confidence in the handling of the 4S. It handles almost as an extension of your arms and legs as you steer and handle the accelerator and braking.

The sports car was equipped with PDK and paddle shift. On the steering wheel, one also notices the dial located at about the 4 o'clock position, which allows different selections of driving mode. There is Normal mode, Sport, Sport plus and Individual mode. The other modes are somewhat self-explanatory.

However, Individual mode is a bit different. It provides precise control over shift points, throttle response, chassis settings, exhaust settings, etc. You can even decide whether the spoiler deploys or remains down. Yet another facet to individualizing the driving experience.

The steering was tight and almost telepathic. The handling of the 4S straightened curves into enjoyable lines. The accelerator was very precise, representing either an artistic paintbrush for your pathway or fear gauge for the driver. Acceleration was quick and breathtaking, even when accelerating from highway speeds. The sport exhaust added a note of raw power and an edgy feel to the driving experience. In all, the state of engineering of the 4S is such that having the engine placed over the rear axle is no longer noticeable. The drive can be enjoyed by both novices and the more experienced alike. Enjoy the ride!


