

Porsche history Porsche 959 one of 15 cars that were ahead of their time

When it was introduced in 1986, the 959 was the fastest street-legal production car, with a top speed of 195 mph, and was widely recognized as the most technologically advanced road car ever

built. Porsche only made 337 examples, and each car had a complicated AWD system that standardized AWD for all Turbo models following it. The twin-turbo flat-six made an obscene 444 hp. You could control ride height. It was the first passenger car to have an electronic tire-pressure monitoring system.

Besides the Ferrari Testarossa, it was also one of the few cars to have zero lift aero. And it had titanium connecting rods. Who



at the time was packing this stuff into their road cars? Nobody, that's who.

Porsches on the Mac, Aug. 17-19

Hello Porsche Club of America members,

Motor-Stadt Region would like to invite everyone that owns a Porsche to the very first "Beauty & The Bridge - Porsche On The Mac event." This event will take place the weekend of Aug. 17-19, 2018. The major feature of this gala event will be a police escorted caravan from St. Ignace on the north end of the 5-mile bridge across the Straits of Mackinac between Lake Huron and Lake Michigan to Mackinaw City and perhaps back. Members from all PCA regions are invited.

The communities on each end of the bridge have become a hub of summertime car shows, bridge drives, and related gearhead activities. Many car clubs and motorized vehicle groups have successfully staged bridge-drive events based in either of the two towns- Jeeps, Mustangs, Corvettes, Mini Coopers, ATV /ORVs, tractors, trucks, even hearses. Just as a point of reference, the 2017 Corvette event registered 239 cars, with 191 cars crossing the bridge. Last summer's Mini-Cooper gathering attracted more than 1,300 cars. Porsches certainly could and should be able to be equivalently represented.

In addition to the bridge drive, the weekend will feature a car show on Saturday afternoon followed by evening entertainment and cocktail party on the St. Ignace marina dock, culminating with fireworks over the harbor. By extending your visit to Sunday (highly recommended) you can choose a driving tour through Michigan's scenic eastern Upper Peninsula or northern Lower Peninsula or maybe a gimmick rally or scavenger hunt (planning is still going on). The day can be topped off with movies by the bay at American Legion Park.

St. Ignace is one of the most beautiful communities on the Great Lakes, with many choices for lodging and dinning. Other local attractions include the Kewadin Casino, Mackinac Island, Historic Mill Creek, and Fort Michilimackinac. The country and water in the vicinity of the bridge is spectacular and offers many attractions. Hope to see everyone on the bridge.

Members and their Porsches

The car that started my love affair with Porsche was my 1998 Porsche Boxster. The exterior is Guards Red and the interior is black leather. I have owned it just short of 7 years.

I found it while I was visiting my youngest son, Michael, and family in Bend, Ore., the summer of 2011. I had flown into Portland and met them at a mountain lake resort near Crater Lake, Ore., on the South-Central area of Oregon. After leaving the resort I thought I would head for the coast and drive Highway 1 back North to Portland.

As I was heading for the coast, in Grants Pass, Ore., I came across this beautiful 1998 Porsche Boxster sitting in the front row of a used car sales lot and it screamed out to me, "Buy Me!" Well, I had to stop and take it for a test drive and of course I bought it.

Now I had to figure out how to get it back to Wisconsin. I decided I would return my rental car, cancel my return flight and start my drive home. What a great trip and the car performed perfectly. I always loved Porsche cars, but always felt I couldn't afford to own one. When I threw out a "low ball" offer to the dealer in Grants Pass and they took it, I changed my mind about Porsches not being affordable.

As I kept enjoying driving the Boxster I decided to look for a Porsche that I could drive year-round, as the Boxster needed to be put in storage 6 months of the year. I came across this fantastic 2008 Porsche Cayenne GTS in what they call "GTS Red" and black leather interior with a 400 HP V-8. This was at the local Premier Motor Cars (Bergstrom) in Appleton. I went the dealer route because the car came with a certified extended warranty. I kept the car until the

warranty ran out and I went back to Premier to get another used Cayenne. I ended trading in my 2008 for a 2016 standard Cayenne that was used for a year as a "customer loaner."



It came with a 5-year certified extend warranty. It has a white exterior and black leather interior. The engine is a V-6 and in "Sport Mode" it acts like it is a V-8. I love these Cayennes and feel they are the best full-size SUVs on the road from any point you consider them.

I got a weak moment when I was visiting my step-daughter in Los Angeles, Calif., in the summer of 2012 and found a bare bones 1970 Porsche 914 on Craigslist sitting out in the desert in California City, Calif. I drove up to see it. The owner was very shifty and I was not sure he would be good to deal with in buying this car. As it turned out, the car had no engine or transmission and quite a few interior parts were also missing.

The key was that it had no rust, just some corrosion below the battery shelf called the "Hellhole." As I understood the history of the car, the owner bought it at a sheriff's auction in L.A. and no title came with it. I worked with the seller to see how to get a title and finally bought the car and had it transported to Appleton, Wis. To make a long story short, I have been working on restoring this car for almost 6 years and have had repair houses jump in when I needed help. I did finally buy and had installed a 4-post car lift so I can store the 914 on top and the Cayenne below. I even bought a "junker," a 1972 Porsche 914 for a parts car out of Kenosha, Wis., which was completely rusted out. The "junker" had plenty of good parts to make it worthwhile to have on hand, as it showed where parts were supposed to go.

My first car was a 1954 Ford Crestliner Converti-

ble with a turquoise exterior and black interior with a small block V-8. She was a beauty. To say I'm a car guy is an understatement. I am currently writing a book of all the cars I've owned and it is almost embarrassingly too many.

Electric Porsches? It's true



The Common View Review of 2018 Panamera 4S

By Robert Dean On a balmy St. Patrick's Day afternoon, I arrived at Bergstrom to test drive a new 2018 Panamera 4S. A while back I reviewed a 2016 Hybrid Panamera S, which I truly enjoyed. So, I was happy to get the chance to test drive the new Panamera to check out the redesign. Driving a 4S was extra-special since all-wheeldrive is a necessity for a daily driver to navigate the snow and ice that pass for Wisconsin roads in winter.



The sports car tested is another fine example of Porsche

refining power and style into four-wheel decadence. The Jet Black Metallic car had a standard black interior, with the Porsche crest emblazoned on the headrests.

The options on the Panamera included (in part) the following:

- 2.9-liter twin turbo charged V6 engine
- 440 hp / 405 lb. ft of torque
- Direct fuel injection
- Sport exhaust
- Sport Chrono package
- Rear axle steering
- 21-inch Exclusive Design Wheels
- 8 Speed PDK with paddle shift
- All-wheel-drive
- Tinted LED tail lights
- Power sport seats
- LED headlights
- 21 MPG City / 28 MPG Hwy
- BOSE Surround Sound System
- Navigation package
- Park assist
- Reverse camera

As tested, the MSRP was \$127,640, with final assembly completed in Leipzig, Germany. As I have mentioned in earlier writing, I am one that liked the styling of the original Panamera. Thus, I was a bit hesitant to see how Porsche would re-design the car, as I wondered if the car would be recognizable as a Panamera.

The styling of the re-design flows in the shapely curves of what we traditionally expect in a Porsche. Hints of the 911 are clearly seen in the profile. The cues are thoughtful, subtle, and certainly not overbearing. The exclusive wheel design is reminiscent of the Fuchs style, but more in a negative space fashion. It complements the styling of the sports car, rather than looking over-the-top or contrived.

When climbing into the cockpit, the scent of new leather envelops your olfactory senses and encourages you to sit back and explore the car before driving. The seating is very comfortable, and the location of the steering wheel and controls is within easy reach and intuitive. The steering wheel is equipped with the dial at about the 4 o'clock position to switch driving modes from sport, to sport plus, and other settings at the preference of the driver.

The user interface of the climate, audio and navigation controls are all touch screen. The design is new, and the shiny black and chrome accents provide a modern flair of luxury. The central touchscreen allows you to scroll through settings with your fingers, like most smart phone applications. This greatly simplifies the process of finding the setting one is looking to adjust, versus having to plod through endless sub-folders or settings.

The styling themes for the Panamera 4S seem to be modern luxury, with an avant-garde sports car vibe. Looking under the hood displays an aggressive overlay to the V6 engine. Back on the inside of the cabin, the PDK shifter is redesigned with a sleeker styling shifter that is more black than silver accents at this point. It works well with the rest of the interior. Looking to the back seats, one can see that four adults could easily be seated in the lap of luxury for either a Sunday drive or wherever one is headed during a typical weekday. This car truly has an executive feel and should easily compete with the variants issued by competitor brands.

I drove the car in sport mode, and the sport exhaust provided a delightful baritone pitch to the exhaust note. Yet, as with the styling mentioned above, the sport exhaust is certainly not overbear-

ing. The Panamera is very quick, and the steering was tight and responsive. For what I expect is a heavier car, the feel is lighter. The accelerator is precise, pick up speed is quick, and the brakes handle very well. The Panamera cornered like a true Porsche, and I smiled the entire trip. This sports car is



designed for someone that wants to have a sports car as a daily driver, but also has work or family needs that require a four door vehicle. Regardless of your need or reason for looking at a Panamera, if you are looking for a great option for long road trips, this car will not disappoint. Enjoy the ride!


