

Tech Tips by Dan Pankratz, tech chair, FVR



This month's topic is **Battery maintenance**

If you should choose to put a battery shut-off switch on your Porsche, do not use the inexpensive green-knob shut-off switch. They tend to fail or

short out. Purchase a quality switch.

If a battery is left in the vehicle and the vehicle is not used for an extended time it is recommended that you use a maintenance or trickle charger. They feed a fraction of an amp into the battery as needed. A fully charged battery will last longer and with a wet cell battery the chances of sulfation will be reduced.

Cleanliness is very important in battery maintenance. Corrosion is common, and this comes from the battery's conversion of chemical energy to electrical energy. It is best to wear latex gloves while you clean both battery terminals. Use a wire brush or wire wheel. Wipe the clean terminals with a rag dipped in ammonia. This leaves no residue like baking

soda does.

Clean the terminals with clear water and coat them with dielectric compound. If there is corrosion under the insulation, replace the cable with a new one.

One area that is too often neglected is the ground cable to the chassis. This connection should be cleaned and coated with dielectric.

Corrosion and dirt increase electrical resistance and will reduce the available current flow from the battery.

If you have a wet cell battery, use a hydrometer to check the specific gravity. It should be 1.265 – 1.275 (@77 degrees Fahrenheit.). The electrolyte level must cover the plates. If electrolyte is required, use only distilled water. Never add acid.

The tightness for the battery terminal is very important. Loose connections might provide intermittent current flow. Loose connections could also cause arcing – a danger with flooded batteries that release oxygen and explosive hydrogen.

Be sure that the battery is tightly clamped into the battery box. Shifting or bouncing around within the battery box could cause internal damage to the connections or plates.

The typical battery terminal should be torqued to 50-70 in. lbs.

Organized by **Dan and Barb Pankratz**, the day included tours of three garages, each providing close-up inspections of eclectic collections. The collections we saw included Dan and Barb's Porsches, Jaguars, a Miata, two Model T Fords and an old VW Kombi Camper – never restored and like new.

The second garage was Paul Kaufmann's Restoration Garage where we saw four Auburns, a Cord restoration and vintage signs. Paul specializes in Auburn, Cords and Duesenbergs.

The third garage was Wetenkamp Glass where we saw 10 vintage motorcycles, several old collector cars as well as race cars. Jeff and Kim Pahl also displayed a 1908 De Dion French car.

At each garage stop there was ample time to visit and inspect the variety of cars that were original, fully restored or in various stages of restoration.

Twelve cars participated in the mini gimmick rally which started after the tour of the second garage and finished just before we reached the third garage. Over a course of slightly more than 10 miles, rallyists had to follow the driving instructions and answer obscure questions along the way. To find the answers on signs along the roadways, you often had to look back over your shoulder right or left to spot an answer after you turned onto another road. Bigfoot Crossing (Crossing was the word that was needed for the answer) was the most missed answer.

The object of the rally was to acquire the least number of points. Teams were assessed a point for missing a question or answering it incorrectly. **Eric and Lorelei Scharinger** aced the questions but did not have the mileage correct. The Scharinger 928S did not have a working odometer so their guess as to the mileage, which was a required

question on the rally, missed the mark, eliminating them from the competition. Dan told us another object of the rally was to show how much fun it is to rally with your Porsche.

First place went to the father and son duo **Jim and Dan Niemeier** (photo left), who were assessed only two points. **Larry and Pat Rogers** took second place with five points, and **Steve and Beth Groddy** took third place with nine points.

Participants enjoyed outstanding pizza at Luigi's in Manitowoc, compliments of the region. Over pizza, rallyists laughed about missed answers and talked about the amazing cars they had seen on the tour. Thanks to **Dan**

A far-out formula: The 5th annual Luftgekühlt car show

Early morning, Friday, April 20, a Chicago-bound flight carried me from the Fox Valley, with a connection on to LAX. A short Uber ride and I'd deposited luggage at my Santa Monica hotel. Now in the Pacific Time Zone, jacket and sweatshirt off, I put the memory of frigid Northern Wisconsin behind and jog onto Santa Monica pier to breathe in the salty ocean air and prepare for Friday's warm-up; Petersen Automotive Museum's incredible exhibit, The Porsche Effect. It's here that the Luftgekühlt weekend begins.

Luftgekühlt, German for 'air-cooled', is a celebration of Porsches prior to the launch of the water cooled 996 in 1998. In its 5th year, the car show is the brainchild of Porsche factory driver Patrick Long, and LA-based creative director Howie Idelson. Like mad scientists, they mix priceless Porsches (Jerry Seinfeld's Gmünd, Bruce Canepa's latest 959S creation, the only alloriginal 911R prototype in existence, Rod Emory's outlaws, Cameron Healy's Pebble Beach winning 356SL) with people's beloved daily drivers (nearly anything goes - colors, patinas, modifications, and more). Their unexpected formula places these cars into an extraordinary backdrop, with this year's show taking place at Ganahl Lumber in Torrance. But more on that later.

Friday's Petersen event was the appetizer, and didn't disappoint. On display are 50 of the most significant Porsche models ever built, with more stored in their vault - also open this evening. To welcome out-of-towners, Petersen had arranged rooftop parking, complete with DJ, food and drink. Hurley Heywood was there signing copies of his autobiography Hurley From the Beginning. Quick Vic Elford, too, recounting 40-year-old stories from the Targa Florio in vivid detail. And others from the Porsche world you would recognize: Jeff Zwart, Alois Ruf, Freeman Thomas, Dieter Inzenhofer. All around us Porsches gathered, with special homage being paid to the Type 964, 30 years old this year.

With the Petersen event over, my mind spinning, another Uber ride. This time just down the street into Hollywood to pick up my car for the weekend, a 2009 911 C4S cabriolet rented via Turo, a service where individuals can offer up their personal cars for rent. Joseph, the owner, handed me the keys, offered quick instruction on the power top, and sent me on my way.

Top down, headlights shining, I retreated to Santa Monica with dreams of Luftgekuhlt.

Sunday morning found me southbound on the 405, top down of course, sprinting to Torrance for the start of Luftgekühlt. Pulling off the freeway I joined a procession of Porsches, one of every kind and color, and followed them to the designated parking lot. Acres of Porsches surrounded me but this wasn't Luftgekühlt yet. For that we got on a shuttle bus that deposited us under a massive gate, as if entering a Shinto Shrine, with the words Ganahl Lumber. We had arrived.

Wristband, through the gate, and into the most organized lumberyard I'd ever seen. Neat rows grouped by species, quality, width and length. An indoor warehouse with overly engineered trusses laid bare, and carefully spaced throughout. Seinfeld's Gmünd was the first to greet us, laid bare under the sun, its metal revealing every bruise from the hammer that shaped its iconic curves. A row of Type 964s in every guise - Speedster, RS, Carrera 2 and 4, Turbo, 30 Jahre - reminded visitors of the important advancements Porsche introduced with this model. Inside, under the trusses, real treasures; a twin-turbocharged 917/10, an 804 Formula 1, a 911R prototype, a 908 short-tail, a 964 Turbo S Flachtbau, Bruce Canepa's latest 959 (the 800-horsepower SC), a RUF CTR2, a 904 Carrera GTS, a Singer-modified 911 special wishes model, and a baby blue 550 Spyder. Each with a story to tell.

Outside again, sunscreen applied, I surveyed the show. The Luftgekühlt merch tent was humming with limited run posters and shirts. People from all walks gathered near the food and drink, finding shade and refueling. All around are Porsches by the hundreds. I point myself through the crowd toward a corner of the yard, with a loose plan to work my way around the perimeter. I pass early 911s and 912s in a mix of period correct colors: Ivory, Heron Gray, Bahama Yellow, Sand, Polo Red. As the stacks of lumber abruptly end and I turn a corner my strategy is rewarded, as a blütengelb (blossom yellow) Ruf Porsche BTR2,

neatly positioned under a silo and framed by matching blütengelb bollard posts, makes my knees weak. These moments replayed dozens of times over the course of the day, only it's rows of 914s, capped by a 356 with a canoe on its roof. Or G-body 911s, punctuated by a 911 S hand painted with a reminder - 'Stay Forever Far Out'. Or patina'd 356s arranged as a sundial, swinging me into a mirrored arrangement of 914-6s.

Is it possible to have too much of a good thing? A Porsche exhibit, surrounded by Porsche drivers, Porsche designers and Porsche mechanics, a Porsche-themed panel discussion, shuttling to and fro in a Porsche cabriolet, and finally the ultimate indulgence - Luftgekuhlt - a kind of Porsche Disneyland?

I contemplate this briefly as I await the red-eye home. No, I decide. I open the Turo app and start contemplating next year's rental.

Briefly, think of a Gimmick Rally as a scavenger hunt on wheels. Each couple will be given detailed driving directions plus several pages of photos. Each item on the photo sheets can be found along the prescribed route. To assure you have actually seen that item, you are asked to answer a question printed below each of the black and white photos. It's as simple as that. You drive the course at whatever speed is comfortable.

Cost: \$20 if you register in advance; \$30 if you register the day-of the event.



Motor-Stadt Region would like to invite everyone that owns a Porsche to the very first "Beauty & The Bridge - Porsche On The Mac event." This event will take place the weekend of Aug. 17-19, 2018. The major feature of this gala event will be a police escorted caravan from St. Ignace on the north end of the 5-mile bridge across the Straits of Mackinac between Lake Huron and Lake Michigan to Mackinaw City and perhaps back. The Common View – by Bob Dean, Dealership Liaison 2018 Macan S —'Few cars as versatile and fun to drive'

On a balmy, bright and sunny May 19, 2018, I test drove a Night Blue Metallic, 2018 Macan S. Built in Leipzig, the Macan S, as tested, had an MSRP of \$73,620 and had many options, including the following features:

Agate Pebble leather interior

- Power seats (14-way)
- Seat ventilation (front)
- Heated seats (front and rear)
- 3.0-liter flat six turbo engine
- Power: 340 hp / Torque: 339 lb.-ft.
- 7-speed Porsche PDK
- MPG 17 City / 23 Highway
- 20-inch RS Spyder Design Wheels
- LED daytime running lights
- Tinted rear windows
- Park assist front/rear with a reverse camera
- Navigation and stereo with Bose Surround Sound

I selected the Macan to contrast and explore the S version against the base model, which I tested back in February, 2017. With the pre-dawn of autonomous electric cars upon us, I thoroughly enjoyed the prospect of testing out a flat six, twin turbo. Of course, every major automaker is manufacturing and selling SUVs and crossovers, so the field is cer-

tainly crowded.

Indeed, Ford recently announced that beginning in 2019, they will only manufacture one car, the Mustang and a crossover, the Focus. The rest of their line-up will involve other SUVs and trucks. Thus, Porsche's foray into the SUV and crossover segment was certainly a risk against purists back in 2002, but is proving to be visionary.

With both the Cayenne and the Macan, Porsche stands

ahead of the crowd with intuitive engineering and cars that are always fun to drive. In terms of overall review, the Macan S, while a crossover SUV, drives and handles like a sports car. This makes it quite versatile and immensely fun to drive.

Operating the Macan in regular driving mode provides

an agile vehicle than can hold its own on the highway. Pressing the sport mode button allows you to feed the need for speed with lots of torque and the joy of driving a sports car while hauling groceries, or



whatever else may require transporting. The drive quickens the pulse and enlivens the spirit of the driver (and passengers). An ordinary drive to work or to the store is transformed into an enjoyable experience. Just as in the base model, the styling of the Macan S is fluid and aerodynamic. The chrome accents around the windows add a touch of gleam to the form. The front hood is a clam shell style with hydraulic arms that hold up the hood for inspection or maintenance.



It has an aggressive front grille and when viewing the profile the eye is drawn to the sleek RS Spyder Design wheels with a nice finish. The LED daytime running lights turn from white to orange when the turn signals are activated in either direction. This seems to be both a worthwhile safety feature, and provides a dy-

namic aesthetic.

When climbing inside the Macan S, the scent of new car and fresh leather greet the driver. The seats are comfy and provide a good view out the windshield toward the road. The climate and infotainment controls are intuitive and within easy reach. The trunk

has plenty of room and the rear seats can either comfortably seat 2-3 adults or fold down for more storage capacity. The steering wheel is wrapped in leather that makes the wheel fit firmly in your hands. This certainly instills confidence in handling the car.

The Macan is very quick. Steering is very responsive, and the wheel base is wide, which enhances handling. When cornering there is little to no body roll. This feature enhances the feeling that you are not driving a crossover, or SUV, but a sports car.

As in other newer Porsche vehicles, the Macan has an elevated PDK shifter with temperature and other controls on the surrounding panel. The leather stitching throughout the car and particularly on the dashboard is subtle, but noticeable with what must be meticulous attention to detail during production. In terms of interior design, there is even a curvy built in hangar hook indentation in the roof behind the front seats to accommodate jackets, etc.

Again, this subtle detail reminds you of the thoughtful design that went into organizing the interior.

This leads to the question of how a Macan S functions as a daily driver? We are fortunate in that our editor, Beverly Jurkowski, owns one. Here are her insights on the sports car: "The Macan S is the third Porsche we've owned. It serves as my daily driver, in all seasons. Some purists might scoff at the idea of a Porsche SUV or be horrified that I drive this in snow and rain, but I have to say that this car is all Porsche from the way it sounds when I start it each day to the handling, fit and finish, and performance. Accelerating on the on-ramps to cornering on twisty roads, this car is a pleasure to drive and it turns heads."

After driving both the Macan base model and the S, it's easy to see why the car is the biggest seller for Porsche at this time. There are few cars out there as versatile and fun to drive. The Macan S is truly a vehicle where you can have your cake and eat it too, with a smile on your face the entire time. Enjoy the ride!




