Nominations for 2019 Board of Directors


It's that time of year again when we ask for any interested members to step out of the shadows and throw their hat in the ring for next year's Board of Directors.





Tech Tips

Tire rotation — follow the arrows

Rotating tires on your Porsche and other cars can double the life of your tires. Rotate your tires every eight thousand miles.

Be sure to check your owner's manual for proper jack points. Always use jack stands. Mark your tires on the inside with a tire pencil before you remove them so they don't get mixed up.



Always check tire sizes in your owner's manual when replacing them.


