"I got it in April 2016, because I wanted to upgrade to newer technology, and have a Turbo S, instead of just my '07 Turbo. I searched on AutoTrader.com and found it at Isringhausen Imports in Springfield, Ill. I never went there, just communicated online and via email. They delivered the Porsche to my home and picked up my trade-in, the 2007 Porsche," he said.

His first Porsche was a 2005 Porsche Boxster S which he bought new in Milwaukee. "I loved the car and really enjoyed its handling. But then after I decided that I needed a Porsche with more HP, on I traded the Boxster in March 2009 for a 2007 Porsche Turbo that I found via Auto-Trader.com in Cleveland. I loved the 2007 Turbo but wanted to upgrade the stock 480 h.p., so I purchased a Performance Package upgrade from

Fabspeed Motorsports online and upgraded to nearly 600 h.p.

"I am attracted to Porsche because they are exceptional performance cars, and are like driving a race car on the road. I also participate in the Lamers Driving Experience at Road America each year and my two Porsche Turbos are awesome performers," he concluded.

Porsche January sales set all-time record

January retail sales climbed 12.5 percent from a year earlier to 5,419. The total marked an all-time January record, following a record year in 2018.

The new, more powerful Cayenne drove the month's growth as S and Turbo models rounded out the lineup on showroom floors. Deliveries of all three variants combined rose 65.1 percent in January year-on-year to 2,150 vehicles. The iconic Porsche 911 also charged ahead, increasing 29.1 percent to 1,101 deliveries ahead of the arrival of the next generation later this year.

"We are grateful to see the year start strong for our 191 U.S. Porsche dealer partners," said Klaus Zellmer, President and CEO of PCNA. "After celebrating 70 years of Porsche sports cars last year, this month's record deliveries show that we are successfully combining our rich heritage with the innovation customers want today."

Tech tips: How to flush and bleed old brake fluid

Flushing the brake system is a rather simple job, but it does require two, and preferably three, people to make the job as easy as possible. Simply bleeding the brakes to get rid of entrapped air bubbles re-

quires almost the same amount of work as a full flushing. It makes sense to do a full flushing as long as you are doing the brake bleeding.

The first person (the driver) is the one who sits in the driver's seat and compresses the brake pedal on orders from the second person – the bleeder. The third person – the filler – will have the very important, although fairly easy, job of keeping adequate fluid in the reservoir. If the fluid level drops too low, air will get into the system and the entire job will have to be re-done. In lieu of the third person, either the bleeder or the driver will have to regularly check and refill the fluid in the reservoir.

Beginning with the wheel farthest from the master cylinder (normally the rear-right wheel) the bleeder will attach a piece of clear hose to the bleeder valve, with the other end in a collection container. A clear hose is recommended so that air bubbles can be seen leaving the system, and it can be seen when the fresh brake fluid has completely replaced the old fluid. The bleeder will require a suitably sized open-end or box-end wrench to open and close the bleeder valve.

When he is ready, the bleeder will open the bleeder valve and call out to the driver "depress.". The driver will then depress the brake pedal and hold it fully down while the bleeder closes the valve. The bleeder will then call out, "release and pump," and the driver will release the brake pedal and pump it three times to bring the pedal back up. The driver must not release or pump the brake pedal while the bleeder valve is open or air and old fluid will re-enter the system.

After the brake pedal has been pumped, and before it is again depressed, the filler will remove the cover from the reservoir, replace the fluid that has been lost and be sure the fluid level does not drop to allow air to enter

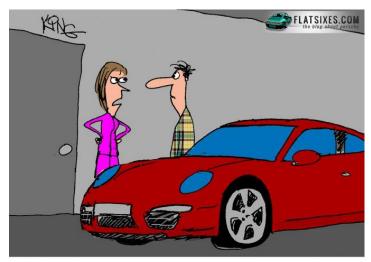
the system. The filler can then call out, "filled," and the bleeder can repeat the depress-and-release procedure.

When the fluid runs clean and the old fluid has been flushed from that line, the bleeder can close the bleeder valve, remove the hose, and move on to the next farthest wheel (generally the rear left).

The entire procedure has to be repeated to clear that line of any old fluid. After wheel two is completed, the bleeder can move onto wheel three (front right) an then finally to wheel four (front left). Be sure each bleeder valve is closed securely.

There are also bleeder kits available which incorporate a one-way valve so it is not necessary to open and close the bleeder valve between depressing the brake. After the flushing is completed, the reservoir is refilled. Dispose of the old brake fluid properly, preferably at a haz-mat collection station. Make note in the owner's manual as to when the brake system was flushed so that it can be done again at a suitable interval.

Chicago Auto Show: 'A blur of multi-media and video'

My family and I made a trip to McCormick Place in Chicago to tour the Auto Show on Feb. 19. It was the second day of the show and quite crowded. As a reference point,

I had not been to the Chicago Auto Show since around 1985. I was a teenager back then and attended with my Uncle and Grandfather, who were avid auto enthusiasts I can still remember marveling at the Yugo GV, which was prominently on display. Growing up on American muscle cars and V8s, I couldn't believe a car was manufactured that could hold a spare tire in the engine bay. To me, it was quite a sight.

As the saying goes, that was then and this is now. And all I can say for the show in

2019 is that it was pure spectacle. Gone are the days of freshly painted sign board and white fluorescent lights dominating your visual field with new American cars sparkling on a turntable. Instead, from the moment you enter the convention center, you experience a cacophony of sound and a blur of multimedia lights and video. The car show

had more of a circus atmosphere to it, versus a more serene event allowing the spectator to actually get up close and personal with their favorite



brand and model. Still, it was a family friendly event that allowed the dedicated (and patient) attendee the opportunity to see what is new and different in the auto world.

Toyota had a very large display area designed to sell their cars, crossovers, trucks and SUVs. The new Supra was their highlighted car to which they dedicated a lot of multimedia spectacle. Ford, Chevy and Jeep were the only brands that seemed to have equal space to show their highlighted vehicles. Land Rover and Jeep had an indoor obstacle course and dirt mountain near their display area. Patient visitors could go for a ride around the course while the rest of us watched and wondered

whether the cars would make it up the stairs, embankments and other such obstacles. (They all made it through the course safely.)

There was dedicated floor space for a super car gal-

lery, where one could check out the likes of Lamborghini, Bugatti, Rolls Royce, Bentley and a beautiful Ford GT. VW was present with its brands, including Audi and of course the main event, Porsche.

As expected, the Porsche display was ele-

gant, understated and informative. The new 911 Carrera S was on display, along with a bright red Panamera GTS Sport Turismo. The 911 appears to be slightly longer and wider than the last iteration, along with having flared rear fenders. It definitely has a muscular look and sleek, unmistakable 911 lines. Also present, were the 718 Boxster and Cayman GTS, along with a glossy white e-hybrid Cayenne.

Due to the size of the crowd, I didn't get much of an opportunity to discuss the new cars with the brand ambassadors that were present at the display. But there was a lot of information available on the models at nearby kiosks, which was helpful.

I noted that some brands, such as Mercedes and BMW were not present at the show. That was a disappointment. In speaking with some of the other brand representatives, I learned that Mercedes and BMW did not feel the cost associated with attending the show was economically justified. That is too bad, because as I can attest, there were lots and lots of families and particularly kids that could be future Porsche owners, as well as other brands. Similar to winning a door prize at a work or charitable event, I feel you have to be present to win. If a brand doesn't get itself out in front of the kids while dreams are being etched in their minds under cascading lights, they may never get to know the brand. And that is why Porsche's commitment to the present (and future) customer is so refreshing. Enjoy the ride!

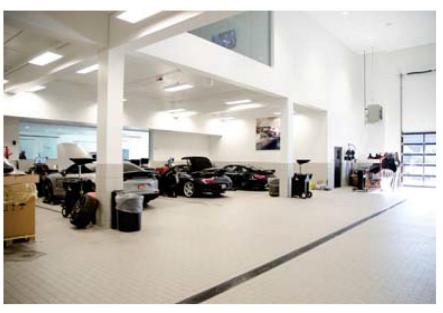
