Members and their Porsches

John "Steve" Kline and his wife Linda drive two Porsches: a 2013 911 and a 2016 Cayenne. Both are white. The 911 has a gray interior and the Cayenne has a beige/black interior. They have owned the 911 for 5 years and the Cayenne for 3 years.

"My wife knew that selling the 1972 911T Targa that I owned from about 1980 to 1990 bothered me. I did not think that we would ever own another one even when she suggested that we look at Porsches. Occasionally over the years we would visit a dealership and test drive one, but I still did not think we would buy one. In December of 2014, she encouraged me to look online. Park Place Porsche in Dallas had several 911s including a couple of white ones with the sunroof in glass and the other options we liked. My wife suggested we head up to Dallas and do some shopping and look at the cars. (We lived about 2 hours from Dallas at the time.) Once at the dealership, I still was not really thinking that we were going to actually buy one. We checked out the Caymans too, but we liked the idea of having a rear seat area so we could keep some items handy on a long trip. One of the white 911s we liked was a new one, the other was a CPO. I was shocked when she said we should buy one. We picked the CPO because it was quite a bit less money and had the longer warranty. We have made numerous trips in the 911, including the 2015 Door Peninsula trip with Fox Valley, the 2015 PCA Escape to Mount Rushmore, and the 2018 Treffen Banff. The 991 is a wonderful car for long trips, and now has about 55,000 miles.

"My wife drove a Lexus ES 300 which was a great car, It was super reliable, and very comfortable, but as the miles piled up on it, we decided to replace it with a SUV. I figured she'd want another Lexus, but she said the new RX was just too ugly. So we looked at many SUVs: Audi, Jeep Grand Cherokee, Jaguar, Highlander, Acura, Subaru, Explorer, etc. and finally narrowed it down to the Lincoln MKX and the Cayenne. I tried hard not to influence her and was pleasantly surprised when she picked a CPO Cayenne at Porsche West Houston. It had the interior she liked and only had about 3000 miles. We have taken it on numerous road trips—it now has over 60,000 miles. We spend summers in Upper Michigan (where I grew up), and winters in Hou-

ston (although we are now in the UP for Christmas).

"Sometime in the late 1960s when I was in high school, I started reading car magazines, especially Road & Track. We lived in Gwinn, Mich., not exactly the place to see sports cars, so the magazine was my first exposure to Porsche. I liked VW Bugs and understood the relationship between VW and Porsche. To me, the 911 was simply perfect. I never was interested in racing, I liked the car because of the design and its designers relentless pursuit of engineering excellence. I don't think I actually saw a Porsche until I went to architecture school in Ann Arbor.

"My architectural education really gave me an even greater appreciation for the 911's design integrity. About a year after I starting working one of my friends tired of me talking about Porsches and told me that I was no longer a penniless student. I suddenly realized I could buy one. So I did. I found a white 1975 914 2.0. I loved it, but, of course, still thought of 911s. A couple of years later, a mechanic friend (I needed a mechanic friend!), told me about a 911 a guy had to sell. So I bought a high mileage 1972 911T Targa with a perfect black paint job. It leaked oil and the interior was not perfect, but it was a wonderful car to drive and a real head-turner.

"I drove the 911 only on nice days. A neighbor let me park both Porsches in his garage. So I was single, lived in a small dumpy apartment, but had two Porsches housed in a historic carriage house. But life happens. I got married and the 914 was sold to get a bigger car—a 1984 Land Cruiser FJ60. (One of our sons owns it now—great vehicle.) A few years later, the 911 was sold so that we could get a minivan. I sold the 911 for what I paid for it. Hindsight is 20/20, but I am now glad I sold it back then. The 991 is a much better car for a gray-haired guy like me. Another son is now rebuilding a 1975 914. I'm anxious for him to finish it!

"Porsche is one of those very rare companies that

makes very high quality things with consistent design excellence. The decades long efforts to continually improve the 911 are amazing. The 911 is iconic, the pinnacle of automotive design excellence," he concluded.

Todd Whitenack writes: "Perhaps it is a bit odd, however our Porsche story starts with a blue convertible 1970 VW Karmann Ghia. This was the first car that I purchased based on the premise that it was for my wife; I know, brilliant right? The fact that I wanted one was just a nice coincidence.

"My wife Sandra and I drove the car many times over the years for our habitual ice cream runs, and she drove it occasionally to work. But then something odd for a Volkswagen happened; it began to not run reliably. By not reliable I mean it would just stall while driving and not start for some time.

"Turns out it was a simple coil issue, but the damage was done. I had to start looking for a second summer car for my wife. It had to be German, convertible, and blue. Specifically a darker blue with tan interior.

"The additional challenges for me were to find a car that would not die and also be eligible for collector plates. So of course the obvious choice was the 986 Boxster, perhaps a 1999 or 2000 that could be saved with just a little work. I always thought it was the perfect car for her. It was during the 2017/18 winter that my 6

month or more Boxster pursuit started. There were a number of false starts mostly involving my inability to find an agreeable price with the owner.

"The turning point came in October 2018 when while searching the internet I found a California car that somehow ended up near Lake Tahoe. Also turns out this was while we were packing to leave for vacation for a couple of weeks. Side note I had rented a turbo-charged Alfa Romeo—you know for site seeing. I ended up talking with the owner while sitting in the parking lot of the airport, we had plenty of time to make the flight. Turns out there is internet where

which conveniently continued to deliver email to me, specifically email about that Ocean Blue 2000 Boxster with Sierra Beige interior. Turns out that by using the internet you can buy a car while on vacation with your wife from the other side of the planet. Also turns out you can book flights, rent a car, and make hotel reservations for a weekend in Lake Tahoe 5 days after you return from your vacation.

"Now I'm not certain how to describe the emotion my wife shared when I surprised her with the weekend getaway in Tahoe plan after we got home. Then I mentioned that I might have bought a car as well and that's where it was. Given we both have a strong instinct to remain married (to each other) and my interest in cars is more than enough for both of us, we flew to Reno.

"We got off the plane and made the trip to where the car was. I would also like to mention that we were not PCA members at the time, but I was able to contact the president of the Sierra Nevada Region of the PCA and ask for help with getting the car inspected by a third party. The previous owner drove and left the car for a day at an independent Porsche shop that the PCA regional president had recommended. That really helped. So that is our Porsche story. Hope to see you all on the first drive of 2020," Todd concluded.

2019 charitable recipients announced

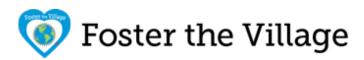
The region board of directors have designated two charities to receive the proceeds from the silent auction that was part of the 2019 Holiday Party. The two charities are Foster the Village, Inc., and the Niagara Escarpment Resource Network (NERN). The total of \$748 will be split between the two organizations.

Foster the Village supports children in Brown County removed from parental custody due to abuse or neglect. Approximately 250 children are in foster care in Brown County and more enter each week. Foster the Village is an all-volunteer, non-profit organization that provides aid to the Brown County foster care community by supplying clothing, shoes, and other basic care items to children who have been removed from their homes.

NERN is one of the networks in the Lakeshore Natural Resource Partnership (LNRP). LNRP was launched in 2003 by a small group of friends who believed the Lakeshore Basin's best hope lay in people reaching across fences to "foster partnerships, cultivate projects, promote discussion and ... advocate for a balance between land use and natural resource conservation and protection.

The Niagara Escarpment Resource Network (NERN) was created in 1998 in response to a conference held at UW-Green Bay which was sponsored by the East Central and Bay-Lake Regional Planning Commissions. The event fo-

cused on showcasing the unique geology and ecology of the escarpment and sought to engage participants in conversations about its future and its management. "NERN is on the cusp of creating a curriculum for 5th grade students in Wisconsin Public schools to educate students about the place where we live," said Steve DeBaker, a region member who is familiar with the project. "We take for granted so much of the flora and fauna in the Niagara Escarpment and special features of the Wisconsin Ledge because we live here daily. We also like to drive our cars through this scenic landscape yearly, but tend to take it for granted," he said.

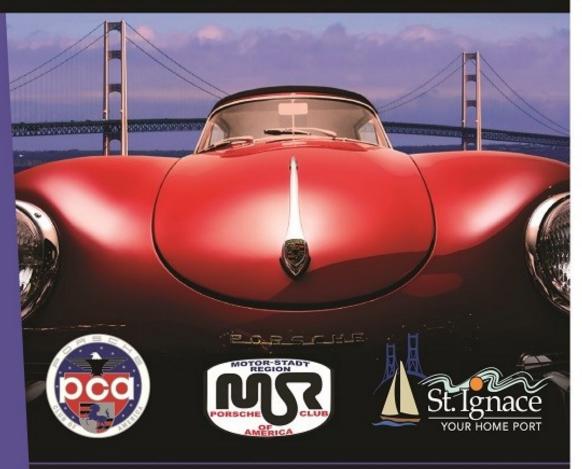
"We are looking forward to meeting everyone in the club. If anyone in the club would like to contact us please feel free to do so," he concluded.

Porsche November sales in U.S. set all-time record

Atlanta, Georgia. (Dec. 3, 2019) Porsche Cars North America, Inc. (PCNA) announced November retail sales rose 11.5 percent from a year ago to 6,326 vehicles – the strongest month ever for PCNA, breaking the prior all-time record set last November. For the first 11 months of 2019, total retail deliveries were up 7 percent from a year ago to 56,835.

"Porsche is on track to close 2019 with our tenth year of consecutive growth in deliveries to U.S. customers and the eighth successive record year," said Klaus Zellmer, Presi-

dent and CEO of PCNA.

November retail sales were driven by the new generation Cayenne, up 52.4 percent from a year ago, and the refreshed Macan, which gained 17.6 percent in the same period. Deliveries of the first all-electric Porsche, the Taycan, will begin in December for U.S. customers.

Porsche Approved Certified Pre-Owned (CPO) sales in the U.S. totaled 2,257 vehicles in November, up 22.3 percent year-over-year.
