

Dave Treichel and his son **Blake** have been members since 1991. Dave is the owner of Zero to 60 Garage in Sherwood and is a friend to many in the region. Here's his story of Porsche ownership.

"I bought my first 911 in 1985, a 1980 black Targa. I couldn't find a red one so being in the business I stripped the car down and painted it red. That was the beginning of my love affair and obsession with air-cooled Porsche 911s.

"Since I've always wanted a coupe, I sold the Targa and in 1988 I found a 1980 red 911 SC coupe for sale at Honest Hans Auto Sales in Chicago. That was back in the day

when I had to go to the library to scour the auto for sale ads in the Chicago Tribune to find a 911. I was told over the phone that the car was like new so I made the deal over the phone to trade in a Mercedes Benz and some cash to get the car since Hans assured me that it was 'perfect.' The next Saturday my Dad and I drove down to Chicago to make the deal. As we were getting close (no GPS in those days, just a map), we drove by this place that looked like a

junk yard with a bunch of old wrecked cars by the road, and sure enough, I saw the back end of a red 911 sticking out of an old shed with dirt floors and doors hanging off the hinges.

"My Dad thought that this can't be the place, but sure enough, according to the address this was it. We drove in the gravel driveway dodging all kinds of miscellaneous domestic engine blocks and other car parts that were scattered about. I got out of the Mercedes, carefully looked around, (sketchy neighborhood to say the least) as I looked at the car I saw the salesman (Hans) heading toward me. He kept telling me what a 'peach of a car' it was, so I decided to look closer. I found that the original paint wasn't. Further, I got in and the battery was dead, so they jumped it with another car and I got it fired up.

"It seemed to run OK so I kept looking at it. I was going

to back it out for a test drive and the brake pedal went down to the floor. Further inspection found that there was no dipstick to see if there was any oil in it, so needless to say the deal previously made on the phone was off.



"My Dad was still in the Mercedes with the doors locked, so before I left, I thought what the heck, I'll offer a ridiculously low price for the car anyway, and Hans, looking quite insulted of course said no way. I got in the Mercedes and Dad and I headed down the driveway. As I looked in my rear view mirror I saw Hans running after

us waving and yelling 'Wait, Wait.'

"I stopped the car at the end of the driveway and Hans said 'I'll take your offer.' I made the deal. We got in the 911 and carefully headed to the nearest gas station, filled up the brake fluid reservoir which gave me a bit of brakes after pumping a few times, dumped enough oil in until I saw the needle move on the level gauge, pumped up the tires and headed for home.

"No cell phone back then either so we prayed that we wouldn't run into any problems. It was still daylight

out, so I thought we'd have a chance. Thankfully we made it with only having to add more brake fluid at the next gas stop, leaving the car running because I didn't trust the battery to be able to re-start it. It was quite a ride home with my Dad looking at me like I was nuts. Ha! Thankfully it all worked out.

"I totally restored the car. I even painted it twice, and still have it today," Dave said.

For the record, the car is a 1980 911SC Coupe, red exterior, black interior, tail, 7&8 Fuchs wheels, rebuilt engine and trans, SSI exhaust, Griffiths air conditioning and tons of miles.

Dave said he acquired more cars after that first 911 and now has several air-cooled 911s, a 2005 Boxster, a 944 turbo track car, a highly modified 2002 996 twin turbo street car, a silver Fabcar built race car, and a Ferrari 355.


"But that first red 911 coupe is one that my sons will have to pry the keys out of my hands some day. That one has all the special memories that go with it. In fact, I used to put my three kids (they are now in their 30s) in the back seat area (probably bad parenting) and do doughnuts in the snow in the Chucky Cheese parking lot in winter since it was the only car I had at the time. What memories," Dave concluded.





Porsche earns top spot for sales satisfaction in 2021 J.D. Power study

Nov. 10, 2021 — For the third time in four years, new car customers rated Porsche as the top premium brand in the J.D. Power 2021 U.S. Sales Satisfaction Index (SSI) Study. This follows two previous wins this year in key J.D. Power studies: Porsche was number one among premium brands in both the 2021 Customer Service Index (CSI) Study and 2021 Automotive Performance, Execution and Layout (APEAL) Study.

In the annual SSI Study, Porsche regained the top spot that it held consecutively in 2018 and 2019. The brand's overall score of 833 points improved by eight points over 2020 to lead both the premium and mass market categories.

Fantastic response

"This is a fantastic response from our growing community of Porsche customers, built on the dedication and creativity of our dealers. To both I have to say a big 'Thank you!'" said Kjell Gruner, president and CEO of PCNA. "Together with our dealers nationwide, we continue to invest in dealerships as destinations, enhancing

our digital retail touchpoints and strengthening the Porsche culture and sense of community among our customer base. I am grateful to see customers feeling ever more at home and well cared for as they select their dream Porsche."

The SSI Study provides an analysis of the purchase experience from a customer perspective. It is based on responses from 35,387 people who purchased or leased new vehicles between March and May 2021.

New car buying process

Customers rated brands on various aspects of the new car buying process. Favorable responses for Porsche were led by dealership personnel, the delivery process and working out the details of the transaction. The brand was also ranked above its peers in its effectiveness in explaining the features of new cars to customers.

Through the first nine months of the year, PCNA U.S. retail deliveries achieved a record of 51,615 vehicles, 29.9 percent higher than in January-September 2020 and 14.5 percent better than the same period in the pre-pandemic year 2019.


