





E15 fuel and your Porsche: Tips to avoid engine damage

With spring in full bloom and summer rapidly approaching, now is the time to get your Porsche ready for the upcoming season.

Of pressing concern to all owners of classic cars is the latest <u>emergency waiver</u> allowing for year round sales of E15 fuels that went into effect on April 12, 2022. For those who do now know, E15 was approved for use in 2001 and later <u>vehicles by the EPA</u> in June 2011, however Porsche only approves the use of E10 for water-cooled engines starting with the Boxster in 1997 and the 911 (996) in 1999 and all subsequent models. Older Porsche models are approved to use only up to 5% ethanol. Under no circumstances should you ever use E15 fuel in any of your Porsche vehicles (or any car not designed to run E15), otherwise you may damage fuel system components or cause engine damage.

Don't believe us, check out the After Sales document on the next page or <u>Porsche's press release</u> on the Compatibility of E10 fuel with Porsche vintage cars and recent classics.

Most owners do not have access to ethanol-free fuels such as Rec90, so if you are using E10 in your older Porsche (or most any car built before 2000) which is not approved to use E10, the use of an ethanol fuel additive such as Carb Defender or Injector Defender is a must to protect your fuel system and engine from the damaging effects of ethanol enriched fuels. Alternatively, Porsche offers a fuel system additive, part number 00004420602, for use with Ethanol enriched fuels. Although ideally these products should be used at every fill up, we recommend using Driven's or Porsche's fuel system additives at least every other fill up.

As always, if ethanol-free fuel is not available to you, be sure to use Top Tier fuels. Other tips include avoiding fill-ups at gas stations that don't have a lot of turnover (ethanol fuels are hygroscopic and can hold 10% water by volume) and stay away from filling up at gas stations while they are being delivered fuel. Be sure to keep your receipt, and if possible, note your odometer mileage on the receipt in case you do get bad gas so you can track down where the bad gas was purchased, as most gas stations have a fuel quality guarantee in case your engine is damaged by the gas they sold you.

Tips:

- If you are using E10 in your older Porsche or any car built before 2000, the use of an ethanol-fuel additive is a must
- If ethanol-free fuel is not available, be sure to use Top Tier fuels
- Avoid fill ups at stations that don't have a lot of turnover ethanol fuels are hygroscopic and can hold 10% water



Region history: We started with 28 members

In the late 1980s a core group of Porsche enthusiasts began meeting at a pub in downtown Appleton referred to as "Between the Locks." Over beer, salsa and chips, this gathering of Porschephiles strategized how they were going to make the FVR happen.

They knew they needed 25 members at minimum to get a

charter from PCA. To meet that challenge, they worked hard at putting PCA membership fliers on windshields of any Porsches they saw parked anywhere in the Fox Valley. They further enhanced their search for members by attending cars shows.

Once they met that criteria, the initial application to the Porsche Club of America to create the Fox Valley Region was submitted on Sept. 19, 1989, by Matthew Safranski of Menasha, who went on to become the region's first President. To accomplish this, some territory was surrendered by both the Milwaukee and Central Wisconsin regions.

At the time of our charter

on June 23, 1990, (although some documents state July 23, 1990) we were part of Zone 10 and consisted of the counties of Waupaca, Brown, Manitowoc, Oconto, Outagamie, Calumet, Marinette, Door, Kewaunee and Winnebago.

There was some discussion about Fond du Lac county and perhaps dividing it into north and south, but the final conclusion by PCA was that Fond du Lac would remain with the Milwaukee region.


On June 14, 1999, our region added surrendered territory from the Central Wisconsin region, and other unassigned counties which included Florence, Forest, Langlade, Menominee and Shawano; all from Wisconsin. The unassigned territory from Upper Michigan included the counties of Keweenaw, Baraga, Alger, Houghton, Gogebic, Menominee, Marquette, Schoolcraft, Ontonagon, Dickinson, Iron and Delta. Our region was also re-assigned to Zone 4.

On Jan. 1, 2001, we did not acquire any more territory but

were re-assigned to Zone 13.

Our first club officers were: Matthew Safranski as President, Dave Hoem (Oshkosh) as Vice-President, Mark Wallenfang (Appleton) as Secretary, and Tom Krysiak (Menasha) as Treasurer. The roster indicates there were 28 registered members.

Today we have members from beyond the initial geographic boundaries as members can choose what region to which they want to belong.

Porsche Motorsports IMSA 12 Hours at Sebring not a good time for Porsche


The 2022 IMSA 12 Hours of Sebring will be remembered for Earl Bamber's late charge to victory lane in his Ganassi Cadillac, a heavy crash that took out GTD and LMP2 favorites, and two Ferraris emerging to stand on the GTD podium. It will not be remembered as a Porsche Motorsports classic.

While Pfaff Motorsport and Wright Motorsport looked to defend their respective GTD Pro and GTD victories at the 24 Hours of Daytona seven weeks earlier, neither repeat-

New regulations at Sebring 2022

Sebring was the second IMSA event to feature new GT regulations, creating two different classes but both with the same equipment. GTD Pro teams featured purely professional drivers, and GTD teams mixed professional and amateur drivers. Equipment might have been identical, but the full-time professionals separated themselves in the running order with lap times consistently faster by tenths of a second. In the end, the GTD Pro winners covered 323 laps—only two laps more than the GTD win-

ners.



Two 911 GT3 R Porsches came to race in GTD Pro—Pfaff Motorsports and WeatherTech Racing.

Matt Campbell, Mathieu Jaminet and Felipe Nasr drove the #9 Pfaff car, intending to give Pfaff a second successive Sebring win.

Campbell and Jaminet were scheduled to drive the full 2022 IMSA calendar, while Nasr joined as a third driver for the endurance races.

Porsche's GTD contenders at Sebring 2022

Two other teams represented Porsche in GTD – Team Hardpoint and Wright Motorsports.

Rob Ferriol, Kathryn Legge, and Stefan Wilson raced the #99 Team Hardpoint Porsche. Wright Motorsports divided driving duties between Ryan Hardwick, Zach Robichon, and Jan Heylen for their #16 Porsche.

Zach Robichon was part of the driver line-up when Pfaff Motorsports took GTD class honors in the 2021 12 Hours of Sebring. He moved into a part-time role with Wright Motorsports for 2022, when Pfaff switched to the fully professional GTD Pro class.




ed their Daytona success at Sebring.

The entry list included 11 GTD Pro cars and 17 GTD cars, making up about half of the 53 total cars in the race. Three prototype classes ran as well, all designed by regulation to be faster than the GT classes. In practice, the fastest GT cars ran with or outpaced the slower prototype cars. The large field ensured that traffic was an everpresent factor on the track and in a crowded pit lane.

Porsche was never in contention for the podium in either of its two classes. In GTD Pro, Porsches got only a scant whiff of the leaders and spent the bulk of the race midpack. In GTD, the promise of a pole position quickly gave way to early mechanical issues, putting a favorite many laps down for most of the event.

Practice before the race was largely uneventful for all but Team Hardpoint. Katherine Legge suffered a crash in night practice in turn 17, damaging the right rear corner. Fortunately, the team had a backup chassis available.

The crew worked transferring parts from the race car to the spare until midnight on Thursday night and resumed their work at the track early Friday morning. A long rebuild day ended at 11:30pm on Friday night, causing them to miss both practice and qualifying.

The #99 Porsche went through technical inspection at 6:30am on Saturday morning, in time for the 20-minute morning warm-up and the 10:10am race start. The warm-up was just enough to make sure the car was stitched together but not enough to refine set-up. As is often the case in endurance racing, the race to get to the starting line can be an endurance race of its own.

Hot Florida weather greeted the field on race day. Rain clouds stayed away, but the sun baked the track and made life difficult for drivers and crews. Seven yellow flags slowed proceedings for stricken cars throughout the race, leaving just shy of ten hours of green flag running. Contact

was the culprit in some cases, but stricken cars stranded around the track caused others.

Neither GTD Pro Porsche was able to stay with the class leaders. With about four and a half hours remaining, the #9 Pfaff Porsche got its brief (and only) taste of the lead. Several laps of tight racing between Matt Campbell in the Porsche, Nick Catsburg in a Corvette and Nick Yellowly in a BMW proved tantalizing—but ultimately, the Porsche fell behind.

While Porsche did not play a role in the result, the GTD class was hard fought to the end. Ferraris took first and third, sandwiching a Mercedes AMG between them for second.

Despite a difficult day, the Pfaff Motorsport left Sebring with a finish and the points lead. The IMSA schedule heads next to Long Beach, then Laguna Seca, Mid-Ohio, and Detroit for sprint races before the six hour enduro at Watkins Glen.
