


Treffen: Georgia Mountains April 19-23

Porsche reports Q3 2022 U.S. retail sales

Porsche Cars North America, Inc. (PCNA) announced U.S. retail deliveries in the third quarter of 2022 totaled 16,581, up 8.5 percent from the same period one year ago as supply increased amid sustained customer demand. The strong quarter reduced the year-to-date deficit versus a record 2021 to 4.9 percent for the first nine months of this year, when 49,110 new vehicles were sold to customers.

Top seller in the latest quarter was the Cayenne, which along with the Porsche 911 was up strongly from the same quarter a year earlier. The all-electric Taycan finished the quarter in fourth place. The Macan remained the best seller for the year to date.

Porsche-approved Certified Pre-Owned (CPO) U.S. sales in the first nine months of 2022 totaled 23,743, up 9.7 percent from a year earlier.





The region has a what?

A free, yes free, lending library. It contains 227 titles, many of which have been out of print for years. Techrelated media, repair manuals, restoration guides, pictorials, and even auto-related novels are all in there.

Since 2016, our website has had a downloadable copy of the library index for you to view or download:

https://fv.pca.org/library/

Simply click on the library tab, then click on the library image. An excel spreadsheet will download. Print it if you like. From there, you could Google the ISBN number or Motorbooks catalog number to get synopsis or reviews of the title before you go to Gordon's shop. (Before

Motorbooks was sold to Quarto Publishing, the blue hotlinks contained in the spreadsheet worked rather nicely.)

There's also an index to all these titles in a blue binder in that same Library closet too, but generally the latest titles have a higher number printed on an orange sticker on the media's spine. They are stored on the shelves in numerical order.

The library is always free, self serve, and completely on your honor.

Just sign the library card in the jacket and deposit it in the white card-sized box. Take as many as you'd like. Keep the media for a reasonable time and enjoy. When you return the media, simply pull out the correct library card, reinsert it in the jacket, and file the media back in the closet for the next member. Much like you may have done in grade school.

Please patronize Gordon Skog and Auto Clinic for volunteering valuable space in his waiting room to store our FVR PCA free lending library closet full of resources.

I know the concept of printed, non-digital media seems a bit dated, but many of these and other limited

production hobbyist titles have never been digitized and maybe never will. Some of our titles are even rare and are no longer in print or production...but we have them for you to check out for free.

DVDs were transferred from VHS, a few more current

DVDs, and published / printed books make up most of these titles. I understand that our free lending library is quite unique amongst the regions of PCA so please utilize it when the spirit moves you.

Now that the Internet provides just about anything and everything you'd want to read, our library may be less useful but it does provide some good historical information, especially about older Porsche models.

So, how did the lending library come to be?

When I joined FVR PCA decades ago around 1996, I asked out loud at a monthly meeting if anybody had any Porsche literature to share. Well, the other members quickly responded NO but it's a great idea. I guess that made me a library volunteer. So I contacted all of the advertisers in Panorama to request donations. Dozens of books and VHS tapes arrived. Some of the vendors even tossed in additional goodies to be raffled off to help raise money for our fledgling club and its library.

Gordon Skog stepped up and provided a Craftsman tool cabinet to act as the library's permanent storage location at his shop The Auto Clinic in Neenah. As VHS tapes became outmoded, Andrew Opicka stepped up and converted all the tapes to DVD. Most of the titles in the library were in fact limited production runs and were published long ago in the '60s, '70s, '80s and '90s. Therefore, a lot of them are now out of print. Some of the data contained in those publications will likely not be reprinted.

And, the free lending library is still fully functional and intact at Auto Clinic for your enjoyment.


